

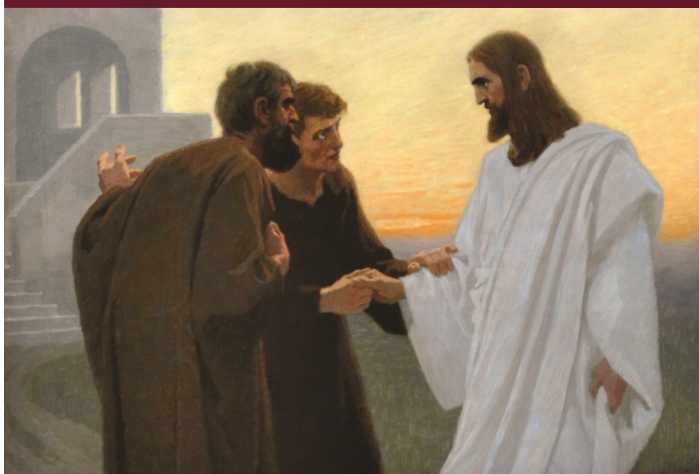

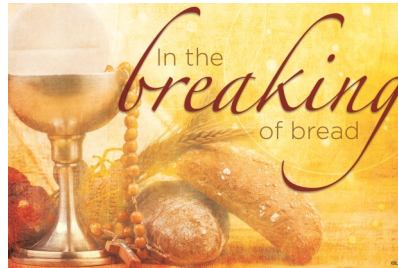

This is the Springtime of Prayer and Grace

God's love is a transforming love and it must change and renew us as the springtime of grace unfolds. It is a time when we prune our flowers of faith and make it grow in service to one another. To encourage our children and relatives to have faith in Jesus is the best answer to life's uncertainties.

Faith in Jesus surmounts our trials and hardships. Faith calls for a complete conversion of our values. Sometimes we have flashbacks in our life with the Lord. A line of Scripture may leap out at us and our hearts thrill as we remember how that very word came alive to us at an earlier time. When such moments do occur we look around and remember earlier gatherings or the scenario where it took place. Perhaps, thoughts of sadness may come to mind because a loved one has gone to heaven. We may even think of how a friend or relative suffered and remember how God has healed or brought us through a dark valley. It is good to remember what God has done for us in the past but let us not limit him. Let us open our hearts to the present and the future possibilities of his grace in prayer, remembering how God's love for us endures forever.

Cleopas and another disciple were heading



home sad because Jesus had been crucified. They did not recognize Jesus as he walked with them along the way. Then at dinner, when Jesus blessed and broke the bread, "their eyes were opened and they recognized him." Luke 24:31. Over and over we hear of people who have stopped going to Mass because they don't feel they get anything out of it. Often, however, this

happens when the outer "form" of the Mass—the quality of the music, the appearance of the Church, the homily and the various words and gestures of the liturgy—become more important than the inner "substance" of what is actually going on. The Liturgy is the celebration of our lives in Christ.

Form is when we say, "I confess." Substance is our experience of God washing us clean. Form is the lector proclaiming the readings. Substance is God's Word coming alive in our hearts. In short, form focuses on what we do but substance focuses on who we are meeting, the Lord.

Soon the month of May will be upon us, a time dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. May we pray the Rosary and through doing so, may Mary draw us closer to her Son and

let us thank God for the wonders of His love.

Diocese of Rochester Permanent Diaconate

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and

social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church.

The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at edward.giblin@dor.org, for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry.

Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate.

The Diocese anticipates that the next formation class will begin in Fall 2027, with the application process beginning in early 2027.

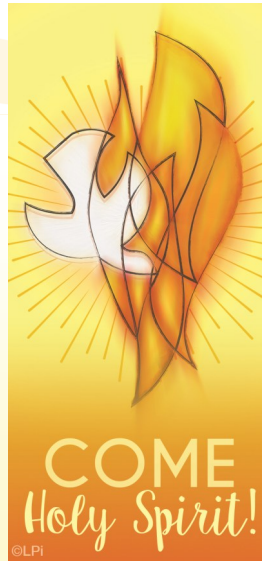

Deadline for reservations is Friday, May 1. Please call Carolyn Kerhaert at 225-7425 to place your reservation. We hope you will join us for this special evening!

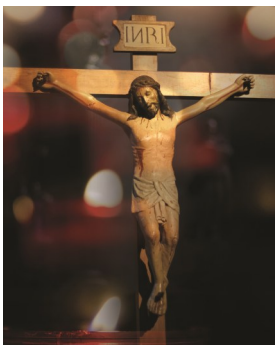
**Come Holy Spirit,

**A Way to Recycle
Your Religious Items**

Many of us have religious items that we may want to dispose of but don’t know how to go about doing so properly. St. John’s has made arrangements for a Religious Recycle Group to stop here for the purpose of picking up unwanted

religious items that need to find a new home.

They take anything Catholic such as Statues, Rosaries (broken ones are ok), Crucifixes, Holy Medals, Holy Cards

(not funeral cards), Framed pictures, Prayer Books, Bibles as well as used musical instruments. Items they **cannot accept** include: outdoor concrete statuary, religious reading books (that would qualify as a Catholic library book), pamphlets, wax candles, angel figurines (saint angels are fine), Christmas decorations, pianos and organs. If you have something you are unsure about, please ask and we will reach out to the organization for clarification. If an item(s) cannot be accepted, you will need to take it back with you.

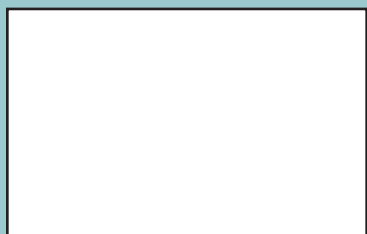
