

Mass—Why We Sing

Someone once said, "Why is it that you Catholics don't worship?" By that she meant, why don't we sing like they do in their church? Getting immersed in the songs with body and spirit, I suppose!



Our lives are filled with song, from the lullaby, to campfire songs, sing-alongs, kindergarten ditties, the current entries in the "Top 40," songs from "our time," songs from a Broadway musical and songs to sing in the shower, operas and great chorale works of art, little tunes we sing to ourselves when happy or sad—there's hardly a time or situation in life in which we do not put our words into music.

Gathering at Church is no different. Here we are, ready to celebrate the greatest gift of God and so we break into song. As the bishops' document on Music in the Liturgy tells us, "the entrance song should create an atmosphere of celebration. It helps put the assembly in the proper frame of mind for listening to the Word of God. It helps people to become conscious of themselves as a worshipping community." No. 16.

And yet, many Catholics still remember the days when all the music was done either by the priest or the choir. But for many years now we have been urged to break into song and praise. This is a privilege not reserved for the elite singers, but a privilege for us

all, whether we sing like Luciano Pavoratti, Keith Urban, Beyonce or Carrie Underwood—or like Aunt Prunella for that matter. Whether we warble or croak, or half carry a tune, it is our duty, our joy, our privilege to PRAISE GOD IN SONG. Make no excuse for your voice. If it is "bad," sing anyway! For it was God who gave you that voice and He understands (and yes, enjoys) every sound of praise you make! Let the words of these sung-prayers fill you up and come out of your mouth, having first touched your heart and mind. Standing stone-faced and looking uninvolved does little to build up the People of God as we gather to worship. Smile! Sing! Praise






Envisioning My Vocation

Inspired by the "What Can I Live Without?" Meditation by Fr Brett Brannen

Every vocation is about brining souls to heaven. Married people are called to help their spouses and children reach heaven. Priests bring Christ Himself to others through the Eucharist, and bring souls into a state of grace through Confession. Religious sisters and brothers teach others about Jesus, serve the poor, and pray for every person on earth. There is joy and hardship in all these vocations.

Think for a moment about how old you will be in 20 years. Imagine what your life would be like if you found a holy man or woman to marry, that you

welcomed children into the world, and that you strived to be a good Catholic spouse and parent. Imagine your career, your family vacations, your joy at holding your first grandchild. Imagine being happy in your marriage. And now imagine your death, as you prepare to meet God face to face.

Now envision if Jesus called you to another vocation—as a consecrated sister, brother, or priest.

If you are a woman, imagine your joy at finding a religious order where you felt at home, where the sisters became your closest friends for life. Imagine how your love for God grows over the years, and the intimacy you feel as a Bride of Christ. Think of the work you will do, perhaps teaching, bringing hope to the poor, helping others find Jesus through their joys and sorrows. Imagine yourself happy in this life. And then imagine your death, surrounded by your sisters, confident in eternal life.

If you are a man, imagine overcoming your fears completely, and entering seminary to become a priest. Imagine how you grow in virtue over the years, and that after ordination, you are completely focused on bringing people to Jesus—through the sacraments, through your counseling, and through your preaching. Think of the thousands of babies you will baptize, the thousands of people whom you will teach to love God. Imagine yourself happy in this life. And now imagine yourself as a very old priest, loved by the people, who approaches death with peace, thankful for having lived a good life, and ready to spend eternity with Jesus in heaven.

Every vocation is about bringing souls to heaven. Whom is God calling you to bring to heaven? How?





Call to Action from New York State Catholic Conference: Oppose Physician-Assisted Suicide in NY

The legalization of doctor-assisted suicide poses a serious risk that it will rise to the level of the most acceptable and even expected "treatment" for terminal illness. Such an option will lead to further disparities in caring for our most vulnerable individuals who could be pressured into choosing death over life by health insurance decisions to fund only the least costly treatment; by family members feeling over-burdened or even those wishing to exploit their loved ones; by medical professionals who may subtly make judgments about whose lives are worth living. We urge you not to allow this to happen.


Please keep in mind the following stipulations:



Congregation Members,

The Board members of the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf & Clothing Closet Inc. thank the congregation at the Church of St John the Evangelist for the donation of 877 lbs. of food donated on March 11. We are very grateful for your continued support of our Organization.

As an example of our monthly increase in needs, this February we served 328 households and 970 people, compared to 245 households and 666 people in February 2023; 83 more households and 304 more people this February than last year. That is a 34% increase in households served.

The Clothing Closet served 105 households in February 2024 compared to 77 households in February 2023. That is a 36% increase in households served.

The people in need in our community certainly benefit from your contributions.
