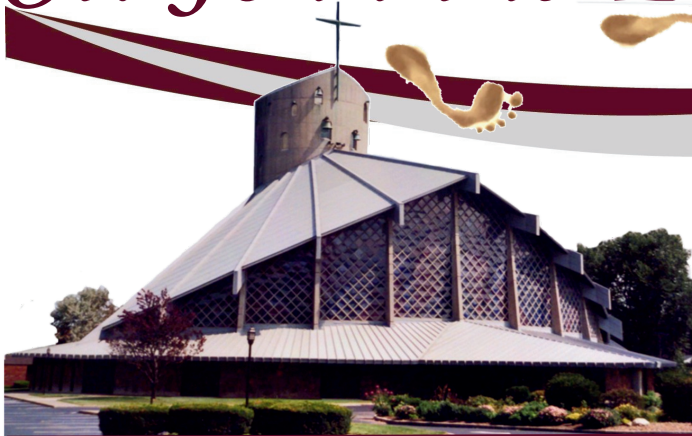

When the summer season comes to an end, it is tempting to feel beaten down during the day, buried under hundreds of details that cry for our attention, harried by looming deadlines, mystified by our children's (our own) moods, fears, or choices. But the truth is that we are heirs to an amazing life! We do not have to feel burdened or confused. No, as Christians we are enriched in every way by the grace of God. What can we say about our time of growing in the faith? What can we say about our parish family and our own family during the past month of relaxation?

God wants us to become confident in the vast resources we have inherited in Christ! Jesus is more than eager to provide us with every spiritual gift we need. Imagine: wisdom, knowledge, understanding, counsel, faith, and fortitude are ours in abundance. ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST (Greece)**Finance Council Meeting to Review / Approve FY 26-27 Budget**

Meeting held on 7/1/26 at Noon at Rectory

Attendees: Fr. Peter, Chris Frontale (Finance Dir), Bob Skrypek (Council Chair), Debbie Smith, Jerry Dominik, Nick Verdino, Mary Speer, Tod Simone, Joe Spurrier (scribe) *Excused:* Bob Gotham

*** decisions & updates are in Italics ***

1. Opening Prayer

2. Review Meeting Agenda - the following were distributed before the Meeting for review:

- 2026-27 Budget Documents – both one page summary and detail versions. Review and approval of the Budget is the main topic.
- Business Office summary information on collections for the past 2 Fiscal Years
- Estimate for repair of Church Façade.
- Bob Skrypek's comments on FEMA Grants for Church Security

3. Review and Approve Minutes from our previous meeting (held on 2/25/2026). This was done as part of the process to get those minutes published in the 5/17/26 Parish Bulletin.

4. *Budget Unanimously Approved***** Review / Discuss / Approve Budget for FY 2026-2027

- Excellent summary and detail provided by Chris – history of actuals + proposed budget for coming year. *** Update *** We show a “Balanced” budget of \$0 Net Operating Income, and we never budget anything for Non-Operating items, eg, income from Investments.
- Key points coming out of the discussion:
 - Weely budget for collections is now \$10,048 – an increase of \$98.
 - Note: there is a potential impact of parish re-organization on Masses and, therefore, on Collection Revenue. Meetings on this issue are scheduled in August with Justin Rees who was named as the Diocesan Associate Director for Strategic Planning and Parish Finance. Tod and Joe will attend.
 - Snow Removal – actual cost in 25 – 26 = \$71,000. New budget = \$50,000.
 - Trimline will be replaced – probably by Van Putte. Tod has contacted them and we have rec'd their Proposal. We are now checking details regarding insurance (very important!), requirements for Snow/Salting Logs, scheduling, and our priority to them.

5. Buildings & Grounds/Key Capital Projects Review:

- Silo Roof Repair (updated 7/9/26) - All 44 roof panels have been installed, and we will pay the remaining \$185,000 from our Communis Acct when we receive the invoice.
- Rectory Rear Door – the new door was installed on 7/14 by American Custom Exteriors and Interiors. Total Price was \$3,680. It is a welcome improvement.

- Parking Lot – we signed a contract with North Coast Property Mgt for resealing and a few repairs to catch basins. *** Update *** *The job was completed in late July,*
- Exterior Lighting (NO DISCUSSION)– nothing to report but Fr. Peter has reached out to different electricians for assistance. This issue is a safety issue because poor lighting itself is dangerous and poor lighting also limits the views provided by our Security Cameras. *** Update *** – *Ami Electric came on 7/8.26 and finished key items. A second contractor came on 7/16 and did some additional work. All Exterior lights are now working ***
- Other Projects on our “list” (NO DISCUSSION ON THESE)
 - Repair of Church Façade. Tod reached out to 2 vendors – Arthur Vincent Co. (Nyack, NY), and Genesee Building Restoration, Inc. (Rochester). The \$32,829 quote from Arthur Vincent was distributed at meeting and we have yet to receive a quote from Genesee Bldg Restoration. No decision was made
 - Insulate Rectory ceiling (to eliminate ice damming) and insulate outer wall. Consider: filing a home insurance claim (call Dan Pohorence at Diocese; we have a \$5k deductible and might cover just drainage issues) and perhaps call ServPro (not done). Consider Magar or Joe P for ceiling repair but delay until Spring. *** Update *** *Joe Petrella will take a look at what needs to be done.*
 - Planning and analysis needed for overall physical security of the site.
 - Repair of crumbling side-walks and curbs.
 - Church Roof – it is under warranty until October 2026. It has leaked in the recent past and due to our Warranty we have not had to pay for repairs. *** Update *** *We have discussed this issue with Elmer Davis Co (which did most of the warranty repairs) and they have ideas on how to minimize cost of any needed replacement.*
 - (*** new as of 7/10/26 – needing action ***) – It was brought to Marcia's attention Friday, 7-10-26 that there is an issue with the ceiling in the church narthex above the center doors. There was some debris on the floor and looking up there is a t-shaped crack in the textured ceiling with “fuzzy” material covering some of the ceiling surface. On close inspection, by gently probing the cracked area, it does not appear ready to fall down but it could degrade at any point and pose an issue. It's possible water is creating the problem but there is no sign, at least today, of any water involvement. For now, a couple of caution signs were placed on the floor in the area involved. Some white or clear tape as a temporary fix could be applied.

6.FEMA grants (presented by Bob Skrypeck) – overview provided with meeting documents. We will ask for additional information by using the links provided. It is relevant to us because of issues we have regarding exterior security of our site fit right into the announced purpose of the grants. The following material came from the Diocese of Erie:

- a. FEMA has announced \$300 million in security grants for houses of worship through the Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP).
- b. This program provides funding to nonprofit organizations, including churches and potentially religious schools, that are at higher risk of terrorist attack. Funds may be used for physical security enhancements such as cameras, access controls, training and other safety measures. Parishes are encouraged to explore this opportunity and consider applying if it may benefit their security needs.

7.Other Business:

- a. new vendor needed for Church Offering Envelopes after recent very long delays in getting new ones from Cathedral. We will pursue sourcing them from OSV (Our Sunday Visitor). *** Update ** Joe and Marcia will handle this project and have already reached out to OSV on details regarding our envelope requirements.*
- b. Possible Diocesan Capital Campaign – not sure of details, but is known that Bishop Bonnici wants to focus on Pastoral Planning.
- c. SJ Social Ministry Committee – *** Update **:*
 - i. *All expenses greater than \$250 for an event must be approved by a Finance – Sub Committee (not sure who this is??)*
 - ii. *all net revenue from an event stays with the Parish and is not necessarily “owned” by the committee for other events.*
 - iii. *Event to Celebrate Filipino Culture is scheduled for Sunday July 26th. No funds have been requested.*

Your envelope number is NOT necessary. Moving forward, you will begin receiving church envelopes from Our Sunday Visitor (OSV). They will be mailed every 2 months beginning with the October/November 2026 packet. Thank you for your patience throughout this process and especially for your faithfulness in making your contributions.
