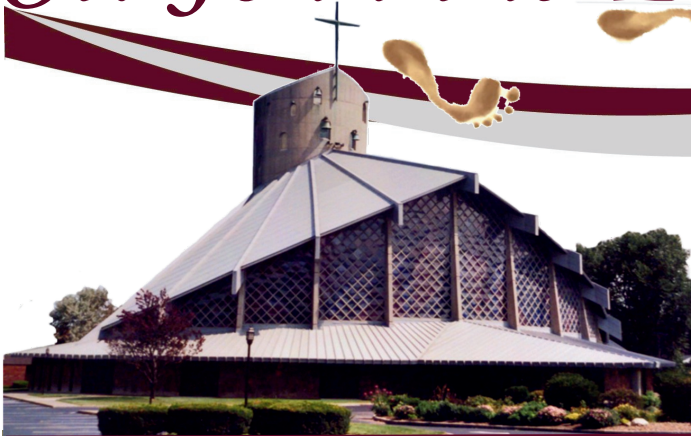

One's Life Does Not Consist of Possessions

When I think of my days as a teacher in a minor seminary in Ghana, I am struck by how often students who are now priests themselves thanked me for the words I said—words I didn't even remember. Often times, it was not the grand, meticulous lesson that impressed them, but some simple phrase that I said in passing, like a tiny seed planted in their mind that flourished.

As I think about them and our faithful in the diocese who live individually in various parishes, I think about life's graces, the family that gave birth to them, the teachers that taught them and the parish they grew in. All have had a great impact on them. I am inclined to think that most of life's true graces are small—small words we live by, small kindnesses we savor, small accomplishments we treasure, and small bits of hope or light or truth that see us through the big challenges of life.

We are called to be followers of Jesus by the virtue of our baptism. Our faith calls for the nurturing of that love in the family that we have been planted into. Our parents are our first teachers in ways of the faith, and they are to help to the best of their ability to bring us up in the church tradition. To be a Christian and not be generous is a contradiction. To be a Christian and not go out of our way to help others, makes no sense. To be Christian and fight with other people over worldly possessions or because we feel

wronged is hypocritical. Jesus taught humility, simplicity, good will, peace, and self-sacrifice. It is not only the religious or the ordained who are called to serve. It is not that child in the family who is called to ministry or service in the Church. Jesus

intends for ALL of us to make the world a better place by our faithfulness to God and how He (Jesus) taught us to love one another.

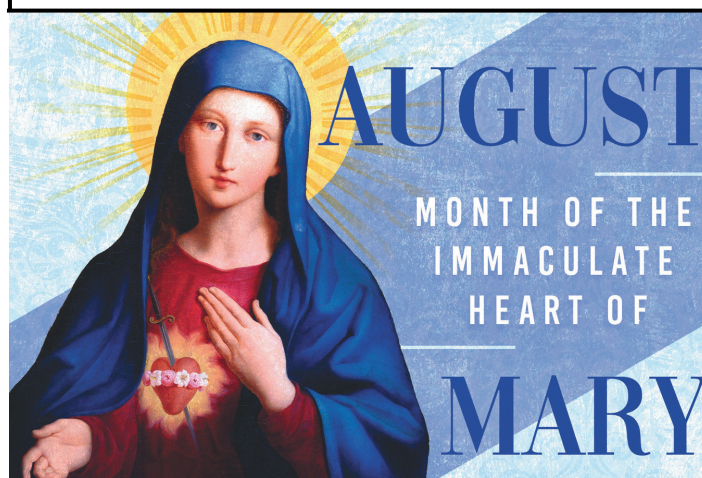

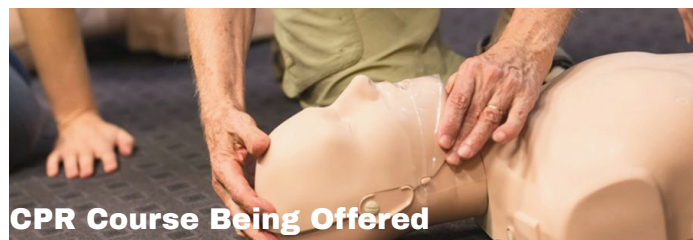

The Miracles We Don't See

"Why aren't there miracles anymore?"

I've heard people say this more than once. Usually, it is someone who is a believer in Christ but not a Catholic, because Catholics understand that miracles happen at every Mass, to say nothing of the other miracles the Church recognizes. But even some Catholics often find themselves wondering why it's been so long since God gave us a good show. A good sun-dance in the sky. A good, flashy reason to believe.

I don't know what it looked like when the loaves and the fishes were multiplied. I believe it happened, and I have envisioned it often, but I just can't picture it. Did everyone blink, and there was a giant pile of food? Did they just keep finding more? Was it all the same kind of bread, or did Jesus mix it up?

I think the Gospel is deliberately vague on this to test the patience of pathologically nosy people like myself. It's not important what it looked like. If those details mattered, they would be spelled out in Scripture.

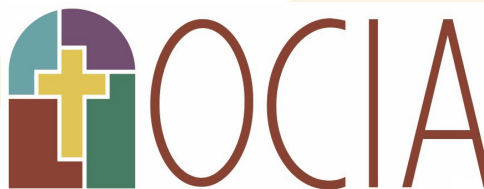
How often we find ourselves unsatisfied with the answers God has for us.

I wonder if that's what Christ was thinking when he savored those last few minutes of solitude on the boat, where he had gone to be alone after hearing the crushing news of his cousin's execution. Was he imagining the crowds gathering on shore? Was he contemplating their enormous expectations for God — for him! — and anticipating their disappointment when every wish could not be granted?

Maybe. But that's not what the Scripture says.

"His heart was moved with pity," we are told. I think of him looking at them all, so weary and uncertain and hungry. Pity — this is what he felt. Not resentment, exhaustion or frustration. Pity. And his precious heart was moved.

What a miracle. No details, no explanation. No dancing sun. But what a miracle. ©LPi

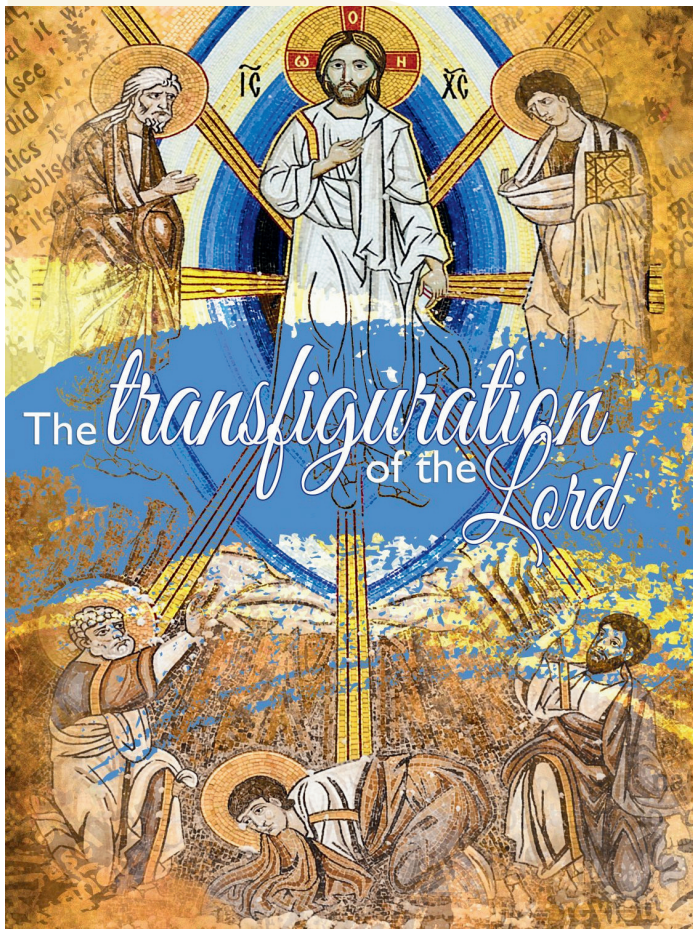


Reaching Out to Those Considering Joining the Catholic Church Our Upcoming OCA Program — *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*

Does someone you know — a family member, a longstanding friend, a new friend, a co-worker, or even yourself have a small desire, a strong desire or a somewhere in between desire to become Catholic? Throughout society there's evidence of a desire for people of all ages and walks of life yearning for something more — something to bring true happiness to their lives because material things do not provide long lasting happiness; only temporary happiness and it's not true happiness. God is the answer here. As practicing Catholics we can attest to the true happiness our faith in God and reception of the sacraments bring us. Being Catholic doesn't mean our lives are void of any struggles or temptations but being Catholic offers us the unconditional love and mercy of God. We certainly would love for all people to know of God's love for each of us and for us to love Him in return. Well, this is possible and doing so through our OCIA program here at St. John's is a good way to get underway.

Coming this Fall our parish OCIA Program will get underway. The program will once again be led by Rick and Kathy Paoletti with the support of our Pastor, Fr. Peter, Deacon Elmer, Deacon Lon, the Parish Staff and all parishioners of St. John's Church.. This program is open to anyone to discern his/her desire to become a baptized and fully initiated member of the Catholic Church. This program is also for those who are already baptized Christians who are seeking to be received into fully communion with the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist. Also, if you are a baptized Catholic who is not yet fully initiated in the Catholic Church due to lack of Confirmation and/or First Eucharist, this program is also for you. Lastly, if you are a fully initiated Catholic (having received all 3 sacraments) and you wish to grow deeper in the faith, this program is a great opportunity to do so.

The Transfiguration is one of the miracles of Jesus in the Gospels. Thomas Aquinas considers the transfiguration “the greatest miracle”, in that it complemented baptism and showed the perfection of life in Heaven. The transfiguration is one of the five major milestones in the gospel narrative of the life of Jesus, the others being baptism, crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension. In 2002, Pope John Paul II introduced the Luminous Mysteries in the rosary, which include the transfiguration.

In Christian teachings, the transfiguration is a pivotal moment, and the setting on the mountain is presented as the point where human nature meets God: the meeting place of the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus, as both true man and true God, serving the connecting point, acting as the bridge between heaven and earth.^[10]

Moreover, Christians consider the transfiguration to fulfill an Old Testament messianic prophecy that Elijah would return again after his ascension Malachi 4:5–6. Gardner (2015, p. 218) states: “The very last of the writing prophets, Malachi, promised a return of Elijah to hold out hope for repentance before judgment Mal. 4:5–6. ... Elijah himself would reappear in the Transfiguration. There he would appear alongside Moses as a representative of all the prophets who looked forward to the coming of the Messiah (Matt. 17:2–9; Mark 9:2–10; Luke 9:28–36). ... Christ’s redemptive sacrifice was the purpose for which Elijah had ministered. ... And it was the goal about which Elijah spoke to Jesus in the Transfiguration.”



Getting Underway Now with Faith Formation & Sacramental Preparation Registrations—2026-27 School Year

If you are new to our parish or have been here and your children are now of the age to begin Faith Formation and/or Sacramental Preparation, the following information is for you.

FAITH FORMATION for Grades K THRU 7:

(FEE: \$50 for one child/\$70 for two children/\$80 for three children for our Home Schooling Program here at St. John’s. If you did not attend one of the summer Faith Formation sessions at one of our neighboring parishes, please be sure to register here at our parish for our 2026 27 Faith Formation Program. Please know that Faith Formation and Sacramental Preparation are two different programs, each with their own study & their separate registration form & fee, therefore, children who are of the age to receive First Penance and First Eucharist, need to be registered for each program. Sacraments are to be prepared for and made at one’s home parish.



FIRST PENANCE AND FIRST EUCHARIST:

(FEE for EACH Sacrament: \$25 for one child/\$40 for two children/\$50 for three or more children). If you have a child entering 2nd grade or if he/she is older and has not yet made these sacraments, now is the time to register.



CONFIRMATION:

(FEE for the 2 year program: \$75 for each youth). This is a 2 year program for youth entering grade 8 or higher this Fall.

How to Proceed: Faith Formation AND Sacramental Preparation registration forms are available on the table in the Narthex in the back of church by the center doors OR at the Parish Office. **Please complete the necessary form(s) and submit it along with your payment to the Parish Office by Sunday, August 23, 2026.** You can bring it to the Parish Office during office hours OR you can mail it to us at: St. John’s Church, 2400 West Ridge Road, Rochester, NY 14626 OR you can place your registration form(s) and check into the weekend collection basket. Please be sure it is in a sealed envelope marked: **Faith Formation/Sacrament Registration.**

IMPORTANT NOTE: A Parent Information Meeting will be held Sunday, September 13, 11:15 AM in the Parish Center.
