

The Coming of the Lord Jesus

We continue the season of Advent and a new year in the Church's calendar. Some religious traditions like the Jesse tree and the Advent wreath that we see in church or have in our homes help us to remember the long centuries that the Jewish people of old waited for the coming of the Messiah. By our sharing in the long preparation in any way we can for the Savior's coming, we renew our desire, anticipation, and hope of the

Lord's coming again. Advent means "coming." Advent means hope for the future. Advent is a time to be ready and alert, while waiting for our God's bountiful mercies.

What does the Church invite us to do during the season? We are invited to celebrate the plan of salvation by which God called the patriarchs and united them to himself in a covenant of love, which was established through Moses. He raised up the prophets and chose David as the one from whose line the Savior of the world was to be born. The books of the Old Testament, in fore-telling the coming of Christ, "gradually bring into clearer light the figure of a woman, the Mother of the Redeemer" Lumen Gentium no. 55. She is the Blessed Virgin Mary, whom the Church proclaims as the joy of Israel and the noble daughter of Zion. Mary becomes the model of our "yes" to God. Certainly a disposition like



Mary's must be formed in us over time as we turn from sin and place ourselves at the service of God.

There is no need to fear the future. Each one of us can impact the future by living according to our faith teachings. By living out the beliefs of our faith, we prepare for the coming of the Lord at Christmas. I believe that Christ has come to us already at Bethlehem on that first Christmas. I believe he comes to us

now, every day in such mysterious ways, as in prayer, grace, word and sacrament. I believe, like you do too, that there is yet another coming at the end of time, as judge of the living and the dead. This is the reason why we should contemplate the Lord's coming as a blessed season filled with faith, hope, joy, and peace.

We should be able to share our faith and tradition with those around us. We live in a noisy world, don't we? Cell phones, television, radio, emails, text messages, web pages—the stream is unending. And not only is it noisy, it is distracting. By living the spirit of Advent, we can encounter Jesus, who can transform us. No matter how embedded we are in our sins, if we look to Jesus, forgiveness is possible. In turn, we become stronger in our faith as we prepare for God's



Corporate/Finance Council Meeting—October 1, 2025

Attendees: Bob Skrypek (Chair), Chris Frontale (Fin Dir), Mary Speer (Trustee), Nick Verdino (Trustee), Debbie Smith, Jerry Dominik, Joe Spurrier (scribe) *Excused:* Fr. Peter, Bob Gotham

Prior to the meeting Chris distributed the following material for discussion:

- Certificate of Secretary for 2025 26
- Balance Sheet as of 6/30/25
- Financial Report to Parishioner for full FY 2024 25 which ended on 6/30/2025. This consisted of 2 pages of information using tables, graphs and commentary which will be included in a November Bulletin. Last year's report was published in 11/10/24 Bulletin.
- Income Statement Summary 2 pg summary by Account covering 7/1/24 thru 6/30/25.
- Income Statement Detail 6 pg detail listing of each Account for 7/1/24 thru 6/30/25.
- · Parish Credit Card Limits
- Lay Trustee Election form for the 2025 26

This 1st meeting after the completion of a Fiscal Year combines two meetings:

- Annual Meeting of the Parish Corporation focused on summarizing the past and sending material to the Diocese covering key elements of Parish governance.
- Regular Finance Council meeting

Topics for Annual Meeting:

- 1. Certificate of Secretary Chris described this as a formal document the purpose of which is "Ratification of Past Acts". The document contains 5 elements and was signed by Fr. Peter before he left for vacation, and was submitted to the Diocese. For background, Chris provided a concise summary of the governing structure of the Parish for which the Pastor is the Secretary, the Vicar General is the Vice President, and the Bishop is the President.
- 2. **Lay Trustee Elections** done; both Mary Speer and Nick Verdino agreed to serve another year.
- 3. **2025-26 Budget Approval** unanimously approved at our 7/2/25 meeting.
- 4. Approval of Parish Credit Card Amounts done; no CC can have a limit greater than a \$4,000.
- Financial Report to Parishioners reviewed and approve. At the meeting we reviewed and discussed as needed.
 - a. We ended Fiscal Year 2024-25 with a Net Operating Loss (from normal operations) of \$111,912.30. However, due to good Returns from Investments (non-operating Revenue) we ended the year with a net excess of Revenue over Expenses of \$55,673.
 - b. Balance Sheet as of 6/30/25 we continue to have a strong asset position. We watch expenditures carefully and Communis Investments have done well. Our overall NET ASSETS (over liabilities) grew by \$55,673 during FY 2024-25.
 - c. Income Statement Summary 2 pg high-level summary by Account covering 7/1/24 thru 6/30/25.
 - d. Income Statement Detail 6 pg detail listing of each Revenue and Expense Account for 7/1/24 thru 6/30/25.

- e. Agreed to publish the 2-pg report in an upcoming Bulletin. Last year's Report was published in the 11/10/2024 Bulletin. It will NOT be Bulletin Insert.
- f. In addition to publishing in the Bulletin, we need a person to present the summary to the Parish at the three weekend Masses. We need a "one-liner" to summarize the results. Bob Gotham made this presentation last year.
- 6. Acceptance of 24-25 FY Financial Statements done

Topics for Regular Meeting:

- Conflict of Interest Forms for Finance Council Joe distributed the Forms for the attendees and then had them filed at the Central Business Office.
- 2. Collections & Attendance:
 - a. Nothing unusual regarding Attendance.
 - b. Collections:
 - i. This year's Weekly Target is \$629 higher than last year and in the first 16 weeks we have seen 9 weeks with a Deficit and 7 with a Surplus.
 - ii. Beginning of Each month shows a spike mainly due to parishioners scheduling their monthly on-line giving for the 1st week of the month.
 - iii. Good news: We have seen an increase in Total Offertory Revenue due, in large part, to the Increased Giving Campaign. Total Mass and Online Revenue is up about 15% for the first 16 weeks of this year vs the first 16 weeks of last year.
- CMA Update our target is up vs last year but it looks do-able given we exceeded our goal last year.

4. Buildings & Grounds

- a. Work on the Silo Skylight Repair Project began in mid-October, BUT.... due to problems with the Crane and windy and rainy weather, the contractor (Elmer Davis, Inc.) decided to delay the project until Spring of 2026. All the material will be removed from St. Johns and stored inside at their warehouse. No money was paid so far. This is a major disappointment as we now have to go through the Winter and Spring with the leaks still present.
- b. We can cover the \$285,000 cost with current assets because we have NOT renewed our current CD at CNB and the money has been transferred to our Money Mkt Acct.
- c. We will replenish the funds as needed from Communis.
- d. After requesting and comparing bids for Snow Removal for the 2025-26 Season, we decided to renew our contract with Trimline – but for just one year as opposed to three years.
- **5. Other Business** Bankruptcy; no major additional money needed but each parish has its own attorney, so there may be some additional payments needed.
- Next Meetings: discuss list of Capital projects we need to consider.

Reminder on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to St. John's Parish


In December, 2015, the IRA QCD Legislation was signed into law permanently.

Under the legislation, donors aged 70½ or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA's **directly** to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transfers <u>up to</u> \$100,000 directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities (i.e. St John's). This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.
- Since a QĈD can potentially reduce a donor's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), please discuss your situation with your Financial Advisor.
- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-fee treatment.
- The gift/check must be dated on or before Dec., 31, 2025 to qualify this year.
- The gift needs to be sent directly to the charitable organization which also has to be the payee for the gift.


