

Tidings of Comfort and Joy

When a women is pregnant, we say that she is "expecting." This is exactly the state of being that Advent invites for all believers. As Christmas draws near, each of us should think of ourselves as 'expecting.' Advent is a season for us to anticipate the birth of whatever new life is forming within us. We might be pregnant with a new idea,

a developing virtue, a new relationship or even a fresh perspective. Faith proclaims that all these forms of life are conceived by the Spirit and manifestations of Emmanuel, God with us.

Advent is a season to rekindle our hope in the Good News, our belief that God still speaks to us in varied and wonderful ways. It is a time to remember that the guiding voices we hear, the holy impulses we feel, and the hopeful messages we receive are God's good news delivered by angels we have heard on high.

It is true that God has given each of us wonderful gifts. But these gifts do not work in isolation. There are some things that we simply cannot do



on our own, and that is exactly the way God planned it. God wants us to learn how to interact with each other and depend on each other through God's grace. Our human nature tells us we are self-sufficient, but God's word tells us something different, "There are many parts, yet one body ... You are Christ's body."

This Advent if you feel somewhat disconnected from Church, from your faith, or if you know someone who is unattached to church, maybe the spirit is calling you to take one more step to become more engaged. Just as God has a plan for you personally, God also has a plan for you as part of his body! It takes the eyes of faith to see it. We need all God's people to come home to the Lord. During Advent, we strive in faith to make ourselves holy so that like Mary the mother of the Savior, our souls may magnify with the Lord.



Chairperson's Comments:

CMA UPDATE: as of 12/2/22 we had 240 donors that have pledged \$50,388 of our goal of \$83,000. That is 60.71% of our goal. That is an average of \$209 per donor. We need to be around \$250 per donor. We are behind last year at this time by \$5,510 and 31 donors. The diocesan average is \$307 per donor. Bob notes that St. Marks has already exceeded their goal. Father suggests someone from the council provide reminders during the 8:00 and 10:00 mass.

COFFEE HOURS: The Music Ministry is hosting the December Coffee Hour with Santa. This should be great fun. I would like to have members of the Parish Council help in the clean up of the Parish Center, after the event. Cookie donations can be brought in at the 4:00 Mass Saturday and before the 10:00 Mass on Sunday.

Fr. Peter's Update: Father visited and had lunch with retired priests this afternoon; Remembering them is very important and fulfilling. Father is gracious about all of the angels that have been taken from the giving trees; As of this morning's Mass, all angels have been taken. Father expresses gratitude for the lawn crew and enjoys their fellowship. There are new candles on the altar and we are in the process of getting a refurbished crucifix as well. On December 12 the pastoral task force will meet at St. John's at 6:30 pm. There will be information in the bulletin about the event. December 29 is the feast of John Fisher. There will be a dinner for prospective candidates. Father is hoping to reach out and encourage someone in the parish to join the priesthood and asks us if we know anyone who might be interested.

Arts and Environment: Patti Hoag is the leader. **Giving Tree** – With the help of Deb Colby, Cheryl Watt, Judy Weiser and Melissa Ryan, all the angels were placed on the trees on Saturday the 26th and Sunday the 27th. There were 210 Angels and the Agencies that we are working with are: Daystar Kids, Friendship Center, House

of Mercy, Mother Teresa Missionary center, St. Michaels Workshop, Focus Pregnancy, Nazareth Elementary, Mary's Place Refugee Outreach, and Families in Need at St. John's.

Advent Decorations were done on Friday November 24 with the help of Donna Schmidt, Stephabie Roberts, Nancy Lader and Mickey Corsi

<u>Christmas Decorations</u> we will be decorating for Christmas on Friday December 23. The Choir will be helping along with others.Father would like the Christmas decorations up until either Jan 8 or 9 for the Feast of Epiphany.

Certificates of Appreciation: Sharon Miller – we have one pending Nomination that is being worked on. Marilyn Butler and Judy Weiser received their certificates on Sunday, November 13 at the 10:00 Mass. There will be an article in the bulletin encouraging everyone to nominate someone they feel is deserving of the award.

Liturgy Committee: Tod (5 Min) – Christmas Masses: 4pm, 10pm on Christmas Eve, 8am and 10am on Christmas day.

Pastoral Ministry/Homebound Outreach Update: Tod Simone (5 min.) Homemade Christmas ornaments are being distributed to the nursing homes. Sharon Miller has been helping Tod with the large volume of home visits.

Reminder on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to St. John's Parish

SHORTAGE TO DATE.....(\$

In December, 2015, the IRA QCD Legislation was signed into law permanently.

Under the legislation, donors aged 70½ or older can contribute <u>up to</u> \$100,000 from their IRA's **directly** to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transfers up to \$100,000 directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities (i.e. St John's). This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.
- Since a QCD can potentially reduce a donor's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), please discuss your situation with your Financial Advisor.
- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-fee treatment.
- The gift/check must be dated on or before Dec., 31, 2022 to qualify this year.
- The gift needs to be sent directly to the charitable organization which also has to be the payee for the gift.

Pastoral Planning Task Force Update

The Charlotte/Greece/Hilton Pastoral Planning Task Force met again on November 16. After opening prayer and faith -sharing, the first portion of

the meeting was devoted to an initial discussion about what we can do to prepare for the inevitable future where fewer priests are available to serve our parishes. Key questions were: How would Masses be distributed across our 7 parishes as the number of available priests declines? How would other sacramental ministry happen? What would we do in an emergency where a priest was unable to preside at a weekend's Masses? Since it is possible that more of our parishes will be joined under a single pastor, Fr. Coffas, Fr. Enyan-Boadu, Fr. Firpo, and lay members of the task force shared what they view as best practices based on their experience with clustered parishes. In response to some comments heard from parishioners, it was emphasized that this task force—formed by the pastoral leaders of the 7 parishes—was not charged with recommending parish closures but with reaching agreement on how best to prepare for a reduced number of priests while keeping all of the parishes vibrant.

Over the previous month, task force members had responded to two surveys. Twenty-one ideas for how to work collaboratively on the Church's mission of Word, Worship, Community and Service were reduced to 3: reaching out to inactive parishioners, a shared vocation approach, and creating a shared website to communicate what is happening in all our parishes. The last part of this meeting was spent working in small groups to focus on how to begin and who in each parish might carry each of the initiatives forward.
