Ash Wednesday: Remember, you are dust...

This coming week we as Catholics will show our stuff to the world. It is not expensive jewelry that you can buy at the Mall, but it is the

ash of penitence we traditionally receive on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. In my nearly 40 years as a priest of the Catholic Church, Ash Wednesday, which begins our Lenten season, has a very unique affect on us Catholics, and indeed many other Christian groups have imitated our tradition of receiving ashes on our foreheads.

Something about Ash Wednesday reminds us of God's desire to shape us into something beautiful. Also, this reminder of our own mortality brings in people from everywhere. After the priest blesses and sprinkles the ashes with holy water, he, together with the deacon and in some cases, extraordinary ministers, puts the ashes on the foreheads of those present; the head being the *seat of pride*. He puts them on our foreheads to remind us of our hope, and as he does so, he says the words of Genesis 3:19. *"Remember you are dust, and unto dust you shall return."* Or the priest says, *"Repent and believe in the Gospel."*

We make no response to these words, we simply leave.

Will people really follow the directive of Lent to pray and seek repentance for their sin? Probably, if we are honest, some will, some won't. Ash Wednesday prayer invokes the begging of God's grace and mercy on all. The ashes express and symbolize our need for repentance and are to be seen by us:

- To give us the grace and strength to do penance.
- To give us the spirit of contrition deep in our hearts.

Oransform us Lord in the Eucharist

- To secure pardon of sin for those who receive the ashes.
- To be a spiritual help for all who confess their sins.

After we leave church on Ash Wednesday, we leave the ashes on our

foreheads until they wear off naturally over the course of the day's activities. They are a public witness to those things in our society we sometimes do not wish to embrace: conversion of the heart, the reality of death, and the hope of the Resurrection in Our Lord Jesus Christ. Are we ready for Lent to begin? I invite each of us to take our struggles and challenges and walk to Calvary with Jesus.

In her wisdom, the Church invites us once again to embark on the Lenten journey. In the coming days, we will have the chance to discover just how gracious and merciful our God is. Through Scripture and the wisdom of the Church we will have countless opportunities to respond to God's grace and mercy—through acts of repentance, generosity, worship, forgiveness, and in acts of service to one another.

Whatever else we may *take on* or *give up this Lent, we definitely need to lean into the simple, enjoy-able practices* that strengthen community like family dinners, and helping the needy through the mite box.

Let us pray that the same God who graciously transforms our simple bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son will lovingly transform each of us so that we might rise, be reshaped and

Our RCIA Catechumens and Candidates

What is RCIA? RCIA is a process through which adults become members of the Roman Catholic Church. This consists of steps, periods, and rites that make up the model of Christian Initiation as restored in the second Vatican Council. Those who take part in RCIA are either a Catechumen or a Candidate.

What is the Difference Between a Catechumen and a Candidate? Both catechumens and candidates are on a journey, preparing for joining the Catholic Church. The difference between the two is simply put: Baptism. A catechumen has never been baptized. A candidate has been baptized in another Christian community with the pouring of water and the words: *"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."*

Rite of Sending and Rite of Election

NEXT Sunday, February 18, 2024, at our 10 AM Mass, we will have the Rite of Sending which is the parish celebration that sends catechumens and candidates to the Cathedral for the Right of Election. The Rite of Sending was developed to allow members of the faith community to experience some aspect of the Right of Election. It usually coincides with the First Sunday of Lent. This same day, Sunday, February 18, 2024, at 2 PM, the catechumens and candidates, together with their sponsors, will go to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election with Bishop Matano. The catechumens will inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect as a pledge of fidelity and Bishop Matano, as shepherd of the Diocese of Rochester, declares them "elect" (the chosen ones). They now begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment – the final preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

As individuals and as a faith community let us pray for our **catechumens**—**Michael Ayzenberg** and **Shanshan Wen**, and our **candidates**—**Judie Sanders** and **Mildred Schenkel**. May God bless each and every one of us on our faith journeys as together we *Go Forth with Christ*.

The act of putting on ashes symbolizes fragility and mortality, and the need to

be redeemed by the mercy of God. Far from being a merely external act, the Church has retained the use of ashes to symbolize that attitude of internal penance to which all the baptized are called during Lent.

Ashes will be imposed in the traditional manner, making the Sign of the Cross with the thumb on the foreheads of the faithful, while praying each time: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return", or "Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

Our Lenten Sacrifice

Days of Abstinence: On Ash Wednesday, all Fridays* in Lent, and Good Friday—No meat can be taken by all who have reached their 14th birthday.

Days of Fast: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—A limit of one full meatless meal for all who have reached their 18th birthday and have not as yet reached their 60th birthday. Sufficient food is allowed at other meal times to sustain strength. No eating between meals. These regulations ought to be observed by all Catholics unless there is a truly important reason, such as health, that prevents their observance. While no dispensation is needed in these cases, a substitute Act of Penance (fasting, prayer, or act of charity) should be done.

Weekdays of Lent: No obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended

Easter Duty Obligation: Must be made from the First Sunday in Lent (February 18) through Trinity Sunday (May 26)

Self-Denial: This is encouraged on a voluntary basis. Acts may include daily Mass, spiritual study, Lenten Devotions, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, and deeds of mercy and kindness.
