The Mass— What to Do When You Come to Church

When you come to church, be sure to greet other people who are coming to church. We are a family and we act like family

when we show friendship and care for each other. When coming to church we are reminded, as one of the Baptized, to sign ourselves with holy water. However, during the Covid pandemic months we were without holy water upon entering the church. The good news is that beginning at Easter, 2023, we will resume holy water at the open church entrances. For those who wish to bless themselves, you will dip your hand into the font and make the sign of the cross carefully and thoughtfully.

When you come to church and you are headed for your seat, be gracious to other people who are in church. "Remember, keeping silence together at Mass can be a school for learning to seek silence regularly, each day to be in communion with God." Please know that some people are praying

REVERENCE IS THE POLE ON WHICH THE WORLD TURNS. quietly, some are preparing the sanctuary, and some are greeting each other. Be aware of who is around you. We are family; the people of God gathered together to offer praise and thanksgiving.

If you walk past the tabernacle, where the Eucharist is reserved, be sure to genuflect (kneel down on one knee for a moment) to show reverence for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. If you have trouble kneeling, any other reverent gesture is appropriate.

If you pass by the altar, be sure to pause for a moment and bow as a sign of reverence, for this holy place is where bread and wine will become the Body and Blood of Christ in a short while. The altar is further looked upon as a symbol of Christ —the cornerstone and spiritual rock of the Church. The veneration of the altar is an act of reverence which recalls that the common table is



holy and sacred to all of us gathered as one assembly.



We Need EVERYONE in Order to Reach Our CMA Goal





Our Lenten Sacrifice

Days of Abstinence: On Ash Wednesday, all Fridays* in Lent, and Good Friday—No meat can be taken by all who have reached their 14th birthday.

Days of Fast: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—A limit of one full meatless meal for all who have reached their 15th birthday and have not as yet reached their 60th birthday. *Sufficient food is allowed at other meal times to sustain strength. No eating between meals. These regulations ought to be observed by all Catholics unless there is a truly important reason, such as health, that prevents their observance. While no dispensation is needed in these cases, a substitute Act of Penance (fasting, prayer, or act of charity) should be done.*

Weekdays of Lent: No obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended

Easter Duty Obligation: Must be made from the First Sunday in Lent (February 26) through Trinity Sunday (June 4)

Self-Denial: This is encouraged on a voluntary basis. Acts may include daily Mass, spiritual study, Lenten Devotions, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, and deeds of mercy and kindness.
