



What Happens When We Come Together

We come together in liturgy to celebrate the rhythms of our life. Liturgy is a shared experience. Liturgy is a physical action. In it we must be present to participate. After all, most of its images and symbols relate to the human body which serves as a metaphor for the assembly as the Body of Christ. The more senses the liturgy involves, the fuller the participation. We see seasonal colors, the areas in church better lit than others, the pictures and statues, etc. In our church in particular, we touch the wood of our seats, each other, the water of the font at church entrances, the chalice (the cup) and we become part of the celebration. We stand and kneel at specific times. We hear the Word of God proclaimed, and we hear ourselves respond as a people, in song and in spoken prayer. We taste the bread and wine which becomes the Body and Blood of Christ.

We smell the incense, the flowers, burning candles, and one another's colognes. As you know, smell is the strongest sense and all of these sensory stimuli help to bring us into communion with our past, with God and with all other Catholics as the Body of Christ—the Church.

The Eucharistic celebration is the place where we celebrate our sacred narrative (Sacred Scripture) as the people of the risen Christ—after all, we are our stories. We are the Body of Christ at all times, but at liturgies we publicly acknowledge our past and present, and our belief in our future as saved people. Identity is not lost in crowds, but in isolation. The community is essential to worship and to our growth as women and men of faith.

Every Mass is a celebration of the rhythms of our life in the paschal mystery of Christ.

Jesus

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is an ancient practice. We can see its Scriptural origins in Jesus' own references to His Heart. "Come to me, all you who

burdened, and I will give you rest ... for I am meek and humble of heart" c.f. Matthew 11:28, 29.

The devotion received a surge of popularity in the late 1600s. Jesus appeared several times to a French religious sister, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, pointing to his heart. When appearing to Margaret Mary, Jesus affirmed his love for all mankind: "Behold the Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing." He asked for a special feast celebrating his Sacred Heart on the Friday following the feast of Corpus Christi. ©LPi

Chairperson's Comments:

CMA UPDATE: Our Goal for this year is set at \$80,000, which is higher than last year.

- # of Donors to date – 298- as of February 3, 2026
- \$\$ committed to date - \$87207.63
- % of Goal – 109.01% WE MADE OUR GOAL BY 12/23/25!!!!
- Donors short by 4 from last year
- The Diocese is at 94.51%, so we are ahead of the average.
- What I really like is the average per donor is \$292.64.

January Coffee Hour was on January 18- hosted by the COLLECTION COUNTERS- I thought it went very well. 25 people after the 8:00 Mass and 90+ after the 10:00 Mass. Gloves are to be worn by any volunteer who is handling food to keep our guests safe and healthy. Social Ministry is hosting the February Coffee Hour.

Ministry Backups – If you're the lead for a ministry – do you have a backup?

Event procedures – If you oversee regularly scheduled events, whether it be Monthly or Annually do you have a written procedure? We want to make sure the notes on these events are on file at the parish center. These procedures should be sent to Bob to collect.

RocCatholicNW website - I need someone from the parish council to review our content on this website and be willing to update it. I looked at the website, and it needs work if St. John's activities are going to be represented. An example is the Fish Fry date is incorrect and the times for the fish fry are not listed. I really need a volunteer.

Tod and Rick, I have been told you are the St. John's representatives. It was discussed at the Liturgy Committee Meeting and Marianne Katz may play a role in being St. John's Representative. We will await her confirmation.

Can either of you answer some questions:

- What is the process for posting St. John's Events and Activities on RocCatholicNorthwest? The events are supposed to be emailed to the web page administrator by our representatives
- How often do we review and request updates? Depending on the season but should be done and reviewed every couple weeks.
- How responsive are they to adding them? It is not consistently updated when information has been shared

- What goes on the RocCatholicNorthwest Upcoming Events and Calendar and does St. John's ever request items to be added? We have requested items that have not been put up and the interest is not there to continue and time is limited for our volunteers.
- Events on St. John's page do not appear up to date, the currently posted ones have been corrected.
- It would be nicer if that webpage had a link to our site so that we wouldn't have to update both places.

Certificate of Appreciation: No nominations pending, currently.

Deacon Lon has done many events at St Johns including Socktober, Bereavement meetings, Lenten Retreat, 2 Dady Concerts and so much more.

DEACON LON SMITH UPDATE:

Bereavement: During the season of Lent, I have invited those who attend the bereavement program to participate in The Lenten Book Review. This is to not only heighten their spirituality but also to build in a social component to their life.

Lent: *The Seven Pillars of Catholic Spirituality* - by Matthew Kelly will be discussed during the 5 weeks of Lent. All are encouraged to read this book and grow in their faith. Those who wish to participate are invited to attend our small group round table discussions.

The additional details of our Parish Lenten Retreat were outlined in last month's minutes as well as for parishioners in the last few bulletins. **The retreat will be led by Melissa Kabasin, Carolyn Kerhaert, Jill Finan, Patty Hoag, and Dan Kabasin.** There will also be a 2-evening retreat session offered by the 7 parishes, but I am not part of the planning for this event.

FATHER PETER'S UPDATE:

- Calendar for the Lenten Retreat will be published and shared as well as our parish's events.
- There is a lot of snow around the church, and it is cold but due to the design of the church there is little more that we can do. The furnaces are working properly.
- We are looking forward to the new bishop's arrival
- The collection envelopes were delayed due to technical difficulty at the manufacturer. Parishioners have started to receive them at this time.

Social Committee: Karen and Melissa – There will be a social committee meeting next Thursday to talk about an event for the spring or summer. We are brainstorming some ideas for events after Easter. (The Easter Egg Hunt is already planned, and Melissa K and Melissa Ryan are going to be hosting as Karen will be on vacation at that time).

Arts and Environment: Lenten preparations and orders have been started and are ready to go.

If you see something, say something


Gary suggested that if we have the manpower, we can approach the parishioner and escort them into the church to make sure they don't fall.






