

Moment of Mercy

After the opening greeting at Mass, we have a Penitential Rite so that we as a people would recognize God's mercy in the face or our sinfulness. Our prayers show God and ourselves that we are in the process of converting and that we are in need of reconciliation with God and others.

When the priest who is leading the Mass says, "Let us call to mind our sins and ask for God's mercy," it is

time for us to personally ask God to forgive anything we have done wrong or something we failed to do. We then speak words together which either show that we as a people have sinned (I confess to Almighty God and to you my brothers



and sisters...etc.) or words that proclaim God's mercy (Lord have mercy.) Like the sign of peace, this moment of mercy makes us think of Jesus' words, "If you bring your gifts to the altar and you recall that you are angry at your brother or sister, first go and make peace with him or her, then come and offer your gifts." This moment of mercy at the start of Mass is a strong interior moment that leads to peace with God and peace with one another. So please,

kindly avail yourself to the flow of the Spirit within you.

Pastoral Planning Task Force Update

The Charlotte/Greece/Hilton Pastoral Planning Task Force met on January 10. The meeting began with updates about the many things the parishes

are doing collaboratively. We have a new name: Roc Catholics Northwest! You may have noticed this name and a new logo at the end of the Advent flyer. The Evangelization Team is now creating a flyer for Ash Wednesday Masses and other Lent events. The Website Committee is working hard to get a shared website in place before Lent begins. The Vocations Committee is choosing strategies to foster vocations. There will be a **Roc** Catholics Northwest Lent Retreat on March 17-19more information to come. The bulk of the meeting was devoted to continuing to improve a draft recommendation for the time when the number of parish pastoral leaders decreases from the current six. Parish staff members will be asked for their input on February 27 followed by pastoral and finance councils on April 22. There will be parishioner meetings on a date or dates TBD. We recognize that any implementation of these proposals would be at the discretion of the Bishop of Rochester. 
