Bishop Clark was ordained a priest in Rome on December 19, 1962, ordained a bishop by Pope Saint John Paul II on May 27, 1979, and installed as the eighth Bishop of Rochester on June 26, 1979, serving our diocese for over 33 years until his resignation was accepted on September 21, 2012. Bishop Clark meant so much to many and I remember him fondly. He was very kind and always reaching out to people; not only Catholics but people of all faiths. Each year he remembered my birthday and was sure to send me a card with a nice note. I am grateful for his many years of faithful service to all God's People especially here in our diocese. May he rest in perfect peace in the heavenly abode.
