



The Heart of Gratitude

A blind boy sat on the steps of a building with a hat by his feet. He held up a sign which read: "I am blind, please help." There were only a few coins in the hat. A man was walking by. He took a few coins from his pocket and dropped them into the hat. He then took the sign, turned it around and wrote some words. He put the sign back so that everyone who walked by would see the new words.

Soon the boy's hat began to fill up. A lot more people were giving money to the blind boy. That afternoon the man who had changed the sign came to see how things were going for the boy. The boy recognized his footsteps and asked, "Were you the one who had changed my sign this morning? What did you write?" The man said, "I only wrote the truth. I said what you said but in a different way." I wrote: "Today is a beautiful day but I cannot see it."

You see, both signs simply said the boy was blind. The first sign said the boy was blind. The second sign told people that they were so lucky that they were not blind. Moral of the story is: Be thankful for what you have. Be creative. Be innovative. Think differently and positively.



When a situation in life gives you 100 reasons to cry, show life that you have 1,000 more reasons to smile. Face your past without regret. Handle your present with confidence. Prepare for the future without fear. Keep the faith and drop the fear. These are among the many human reasons why we come to God in Church. In Church, the faithful find a spiritual

home filled with love, encouragement, and support. The Church is where we are called to experience the strong sacramental life that empowers us to go forth as witnesses of the Gospel.

By the virtue of our Baptism, each one is called to be a vibrant and active member of Christ's Body, the Church. No one is exempt. Bishop John S. Bonnici
Tenth Bishop of the
Diocese of Rochester**

By now you are aware Pope Leo XIV has accepted Bishop Salvatore R. Matano's letter of resignation and has appointed Auxiliary Bishop John S. Bonnici of New York City as the **Tenth Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester** to succeed The Most Rev. Salvatore R. Matano.

For those who are unaware, when a bishop reaches age 75, the age of mandatory retirement in the Catholic Church, he is required by Church law to submit his letter of resignation to the Holy Father. Bishop Matano, now 79 years of age, has had his letter of resignation accepted by the Holy Father. The day has come in the dawning of this new year. On January 7, 2026, the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, made his appointment of Bishop John S. Bonnici to lead the Diocese of Rochester as its 10th Bishop. We look forward to a new beginning as Bishop-Elect Bonnici will be installed on March 19, 2026, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, as Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester.

We reminisce on the time Bishop Matano has led our diocese over the years through many good times, through trying times in our community, nation, and world, and through the unsettling and very difficult sexual abuse scandal. Through it all, Bishop Matano has encouraged us to keep the faith, love one another and remain close to God in prayer always. Now serving as the Apostolic Administrator of our diocese, let us continue to pray for Bishop Matano during the closing days of his active ministry. May our good and gracious God bless him with good health, happiness and peace.



Virtues, Explained! Peace

Peace, Explained! Peace. There may be no other word in the English language, writes Msgr. Stuart Swetland in Catholic Answers, “more susceptible to sloganeering, and thus misunderstanding.” But what is peace, in the context of Catholic virtue?

The peace of God, writes Paul in his Letter to the Philippians, “surpasses all understanding.” Phil. 4:7 Peace is both a fruit of charity CCC 1829 and a fruit of the Spirit CCC 1832. Our modern Catholic understanding of peace is derived from the Hebrew concept of shalom, or wholeness, and it refers not just to an absence of violence (mandated by the fifth commandment) but to a personal reconciliation with one’s Creator. Peace is a spiritual effect of the Sacrament of Reconciliation CCC 1496.

Our search for interior peace in our hearts parallels the historic struggle of mankind to realize peace in the world by practicing justice. “When we hear the Gospel, dear brothers and sisters,” said Pope Benedict, “we learn to build peace on the truth of a daily life inspired by the commandment of love.”





