

Making Changes in Our Lives in Order to Please God

Many people like a good story, especially a story filled with imagery and action. A good story is one to which people can relate and one they can clearly understand. The best story, however, is one that gives people a lesson they can apply to their lives. If we tell ourselves, I think I can, I think I can, Jesus will be there to help us overcome any obstacles we may face and help us move along on the fast track to eternal life.

One of the most futile enterprises anyone can undertake is to please everybody. The only person we should try to please is God. Politicians are sometimes accused of finding out what people want them to say before they speak. Few people deliberately choose to offend others; most people want to be liked and appreciated.

While most of us want to liked, there comes a time when swimming upstream against the prevailing current is the only way our conscience will let us go. Parents teach their children not to be swayed by peer pressure but ask them to do what they know is right in their hearts. How comfortable have we become with God's law?

The Lord repeatedly challenges our worldly opinions and attitudes and we find them when we walk in the shoes of the aged, the abandoned and the

forgotten. These people, we have them in all aspects of our lives. Do we have faith enough to risk making some changes in our lives in order to please God? How many times do we miss God's blessings because they are not packaged in the way we would expect them? When was the last time you shared with other people what Christ has done for you? If we want the Good News of salvation to spread, then we must be like those before us and be unafraid to share it with others. Tell the stories, share the pain and joy, help build up God's kingdom here on earth through our positive attitude in what Jesus has done for us. Let us pray that the Spirit of Jesus will be in our hearts at all times so that nothing can ever separate us from the love of God and neighbor.



Did you know that our Knights of Columbus Council 3892 helps support St. John the Evangelist Church through the various activities the Council leads? Well they do and we'd like to share with you how they have done so.

I will start with the "delicious" **Fish Fry** since this is coming our way again soon. This is very popular not only within our parish community but in the surrounding community as well. The Fish Fry is a joint venture with the Knights leading the way and St. John's volunteers stepping up to bring this together so nicely. Last year, in 2023, the net profit for St. John's was \$3,908.05 along with \$782.61 provided for Utilities. This year's Fish Frys will be getting underway before too long; look for more info in the next couple of bulletins.

The annual **Chicken BBQ** is run by the Knights and in 2023 they donated \$200.00 to St. John's.

You're probably familiar with the Knights of Columbus selling **C&B** (Charity & Benevolent) tickets before and after weekend Masses a couple of times a year here at St. John's. Based on ticket sales here in 2023, they presented us with a \$288 check. Thanks to those of you who purchased tickets.

Parish Council Meeting Minutes—January 8, 2024

Chairperson's Comments:

CMA UPDATE: Our Goal for this year is set at \$81,000, which is lower than last year.

As of January 5, 2024

- # of Donors to date 307
- \$\$ committed to date \$81,327.
- Average per Donor \$264.91
- % of Goal 100.40%
- 4 less Donors than last year at this time
- \$\$ ahead of last year \$9,142.25
- We have made our Goal!!!! We reached our goal by January 1st this year with an average donation of \$264.

We reached our CMA goal last year (2022-2023) of \$83,000 by March 28th, 2023. We ended with 339 donors and an average donation of \$246.

St. John the Evangelist Parish FEAST DAY: The Mass, Benediction, Adoration, Movie, Discussion, and luncheon, all were handled very nicely. There were 33 parishioners that attended the feast day.

FOOD COLLECTION DAYS: Pam has been working on organizing a plan for the food collections to support the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf. It was decided at the meeting that the collection will take place every other month. Pam will reach out to some of the parishioners that have trucks that may be able to help with transporting the food on the Monday after the collection. Gary stopped at the food shelf, and they will have boxes for us to use to collect the food. Father thanked Pam for organizing this very important need in our community.

Fr. Peter 's Update:

- Father thanked Patty and the arts and environment committee for all of their efforts during the advent season and for the beautiful decorations in our church. He also thanked the Music Ministry for the beautiful music, and all of his staff.
- Father said that two weeks ago at the 10 AM Mass the RCIA candidates were introduced. He plans on supporting them with their classes.
- Bob let Father know that some of the parishioners were not happy that the readings will no longer be in the bulletin.
 Father explained that the cost for the copyright for the readings is \$5000.00. This is something that the diocese did during covid, but it is no longer necessary because the readings are in the Missalettes that can be found in our pews.
- Father said that Lent is coming very quickly. Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day this year. The Masses will be at 7 AM, 12:05 PM and 6 PM. The 7-parish retreat

- will be held on March 17th,18th and 19th. We are still trying to decide on a date for the St. Joseph's table. Father said he would like to show the movie that was shown at the St John the Evangelist Feast luncheon one day during lent. He would like parishioners to get outside of their comfort zone and do something here that they can take home with them that they learned, pray about it during lent and take our faith seriously. We need to have the ability to grow our faith, it is so important to know how important our faith is.
- Mary Martha asked if she could attend the meeting and talk about a proposal she had for our parish. Father asked Mary Martha to speak about it. Mary Martha told us that her son's church in Ohio has had someone in their church praying every hour of every day since October 1st. Mary Martha said that we need to get into church and sit and feel Jesus, he needs to be in our lives. Mary Martha said that her son's parish had a sign up for those who were interested in this. There was a keypad installed at the church and only those that had signed up were given the code to go into the church. Mary Martha asked if this was something we could propose to do at our church. There was a lot of talk and concern from the council regarding the safety of someone sitting in church by themselves. There was some discussion about doing this during business hours only and parishioners that signed up could sign out a key to the church from the parish office and let themselves in and then return the key when they were finished. Paul said that good things happen at a parish when you have a Eucharist Adoration like this and he feels as though it would be a blessing for our parish. Father said the Council would consider and discuss further and that Mary Martha should pursue gathering more information concerning the questions asked. Mary Martha will need to do the groundwork to make this happen.

Arts and Environment: The Giving Tree Total was \$10,687. There were 240 Angels on the trees and all 240 were returned. Patty said that next year we will be going back to buying gifts for the recipients. Daystar Kids \$960, Focus Pregnancy \$1,605, Friendship Center \$1,105, Nazareth Elementary \$1,660, House of Mercy \$1,105, The Margaret Home \$1,000, St. Michael's Woodshop \$660, Mary's Place Refugee Outreach \$842, Families in Need at St. John's \$450, Mother Teresa Missionary Center at Holy Apostles \$1,300.

COFFEE HOUR WITH SANTA: On Sunday December 10th following the 10:00 AM Mass. – The Choir Ministry hosted the Coffee Hour with Santa. It was well attended and there were many smiling faces in the Parish Center. There were 25 children that visited Santa.

Certificates of Appreciation: Sharon said that there are 2 certificates ready to be presented and another in the works. There were 3 recommendations for people that have already received a certificate. Sharon said this shows that the people that volunteer their time continue to be noticed and this illustrates that recipients, volunteer and contribute in multiple and different services/ministries for the Parish.

Liturgy Committee: The Feast of St Blaise and the blessing of the throats will be the weekend of Feb 2nd and 3rd. Tod said that he will ask 6 ministries to choose a Friday

Pastoral Ministry/Homebound Outreach Update: Tod said the year has not started out well with 4 funerals already.

Knights of Columbus Council 3892: Update: Rick said the Knights will be hosting a holy hour at 7 PM on February 12th at St. Charles Church. The Fish Fry's will begin on February 16th. The cost will be \$14.00 and you may dine at the parish center or take your dinner to go. Father asked Rick if he could look back to the profit that was made for our parish from last year's Fish Fry's and publish it in the bulletin. He would like the parishioners to be able to see how supporting the fish fry's benefits our parish.

Outreach – Social Media/Communications
Committee Update: Gary gave us an update with some numbers of people visiting our new website. From Nov - Jan7th 5800 views, December alone had 3100 views. Most of the views are visited by cell phones at 61% and 60% of the views are of our home page.

Christine Paoletti via Cleveland– Facebook update – 592 likes and 769 followers.

Paul Parkman – Today is the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord. Jesus led us as the high Priest into this sacrament and we should renew our baptismal vows often. Paul asked Father if he would renew our vows with us at the meeting and we did so together.
