We are Invited to Embrace the Light of Christ

What would it have been like to live while Jesus walked the earth? What if we could see Him face-toface, hear His voice, touch

Him and walk with Him. What if we were with Him when he made the blind see or the lame walk, cured the lepers or raised a dead man back to life? How would we have reacted? It is tempting to think that we would have been His disciples, that we surely would have seen His power and holiness and have believed in Him. How could it be otherwise? It would be obvious that this was, indeed, the Son of God—or would it?

Perhaps His very humanness would have been a stumbling block? Perhaps we would have found it difficult to see past this rather ordinary human being who dressed simply, likely spoke with the accent of His Galilean countrymen, walked the same hard ground that we walked and, like us, grew hungry and thirsty and tired. Is it more likely that we would have reacted as His relatives did? Would we remember Jesus only as a little boy from our village growing up and learning His father's trade in the carpenter shop? Like them, would we have said, "*He is out of his mind*!" and tried to take him home?

Even today our minds cannot fully understand the mystery of Jesus. Only faith and the grace of God can bring us to believe in Christ as true God and true man. However, if we allow ourselves to be



drawn into His beautiful mystery we begin to appreciate the deep humility and infinite love that is embodied in Christ becoming one of us and offering Himself as the only acceptable and lasting

sacrifice to reconcile us to the Father. Only as true God and man could Christ be both our High Priest and our Sacrifice, holy and unblemished, offering Himself to the Father and bringing us the hope of eternal life. Similarly, Jesus invites us into a type of partnership or relationship with Him which offers us many graces and blessings; these include the promise and hope of salvation, peace, joy, and fulfillment.

We live in a world that so often worships at the altar of riches, power, comfort, status, and individualism. A world of consumerism that expects all from church but sometimes forgets to give back. It can be all too easy for us to forsake the ways of God and love of neighbor, and worship these false gods, ourselves. That is where regular attendance at Mass, daily prayer and frequent reading of Scripture can come to our aid. The Church is us, we make up the body of Christ. These things can help keep us close to Jesus. It can be a challenge to our ego to realize that we need Jesus to help keep us on the right path, to work with us in the little tasks we do day in and



day out. It is the best path nonetheless.

Chairperson's Comments: CMA UPDATE: as of 1/6/2023 we had 311 donors that have pledged \$72,184.75 of our goal of \$83,000. That is 86.97% of our goal. That is an average of \$232 per donor. We need to be around \$250 per donor. We are behind last year, at this time by \$4,767.25 and 33 donors. We need another \$10,815.25 to reach our goal

COFFEE HOURS: The music ministry hosted the December coffee hour and did a great job with breakfast with Santa.

The coffee hour was well attended, and we had 20-25 children that enjoyed seeing Santa. Yesterday, the Faith Formation hosted the January coffee hour, and the kids and the parents did a fantastic job.

Fr. Peter's Update: Happy New Year! I would like to say that you are all welcome to another year of building faith in our church community. Father gave a breakdown of the attendance at each Mass that was celebrated on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. 4 PM Mass = 294, 10 PM Mass = 103, 8 AM Mass = 122, 10 AM Mass = 151. Unfortunately, there is a national downward trend in church attendance; churches of all denominations and not just the Catholic Church. The national statistics show 33% fewer people attending Mass since the pandemic. We all have a lot of work to do to bring people back to church.

Ash Wednesday is on February 22nd and Bishop Matano will lead our Multi-Parish Lenten Mission that begins Thursday, February 23rd with his focus being The Eucharist. Bishop Matano will celebrate Mass at St. John's on Saturday, February 25th at 8:15 AM.

There have been some complaints regarding the chatter that goes on in the back of the church before Mass. As you enter church you should prepare yourself by meditating and praying before the Mass begins.

On December 29th, Our Mother of Sorrows Church hosted a dinner for young men/students who may be interested in a vocation to the priesthood. There were 12 discerners who attended the dinner and Father was very pleased that one of the discerners is from our beloved St. John's.

Arts and Environment: Patty Hoag is the leader. There were 210 Angels on the giving trees and St. John's contributed a total of \$8,705 to 9 organizations. This was almost \$1,000 more than last year. Patty Hoag – All of the Christmas decorations were taken down this morning.

Patty thanked all that helped decorate the church for Christmas. The next decorations to go up will be for Ash Wednesday. Patty will also be hosting a re-potting party to replant all of the plants that are displayed on the altar. This will be held at the end of January or the beginning of February and the date will be published in the bulletin.

Christmas Decorations: The Church was decorated for Christmas on December 23rd. The Choir helped along with others. The Decorations will be removed on January 9th after the 8:15 AM Mass.

Certificates of Appreciation: Sharon Miller – Sharon tells me that we have one more nomination that is being worked on.

Liturgy Committee: Tod (5 Min) – We will be asking each ministry to lead the Stations of the Cross on Friday's during Lent. It was agreed upon that the Parish Council will lead on March 31st. Tod will be reaching out to the ministries and ask them to sign up for the remainder of the Fridays.

Pastoral Ministry/Homebound Outreach Update: Tod Simone (5 min.) - The task force that was set up with the Greece/Charlotte parishes is asking for 3 collaborative initiatives. The initiatives are Reaching out to inactive parishioners, a shared vocation approach/committee, and developing a shared electronic platform. We are in a red zone for priests. The 7 parishes will work together to pray for vocations, alternate Mass times for holy days, and share electronic platforms with each other.

Knights of Columbus Council 3892 Update: Rick Paoletti – Bob thanked Rick and the Knights of Columbus for the Nativity Scene that was set up outside of church. There were many parishioners that commented on how beautiful it was. Rick said that the Knights will be hosting the February coffee hour. Rick also asked Father Peter if the Knights could show the movie Mother Theresa No Greater Love in the parish center. The date will be determined and announced soon. Rick also said the fish fries will begin again soon and he will be looking for volunteers.

Outreach – Social Media/Communications Committee Update:

Website update: Gary Kern – Gave statistics for the St John's website from 2022. The website was viewed 28,000 times. 53% were from mobile phones or tablets. 47% were from lap tops. 90% of the views were in English, 10% in another language. 89% were viewed in the US and 11% were viewed internationally.

Safety & Security: Nick Sassano – no update at this time

Open Forum/For the Good of the Parish: Wayne – Suggested that the decorating of the church be at a time when parishioners are not working so that they can assist with this committee. Patty advised that decorating all depends on when the holy day is. Timing is usually a small window. Decorating for Easter will probably happen on Saturday April 8th. Patty may not be in town for Holy week so Marianne Katz will oversee those events.

Pam – Thanked Patty and the Arts and Environment Committee for doing such a great job decorating for Christmas. Pam said that several parishioners commented on how beautiful the altar looked.

Father Peter - Thanked Wayne for his commitment to being the number one vocalist and singing at more than one Mass each weekend.


