Notes and Actions from Regular Finance Council Meeting

- Review Financial Report to Parishioners done and unanimously approved during the Corporate Meeting; will be published in an upcoming November Parish Bulletin.
- Review Year-end Communis Accounts
 - Good discussion of investment strategies followed by DOR Finance Office
 - The current mix consists of both Equities/Bond and is a bit more weighted to equities than the previous year.
 - Chris Frontale commented that the Communis fund returned 11% for the Fiscal Year ended 6/30/23.
 - St John's does have access to some of the money if needed.
- Review Financial Statements for previous Fiscal Year and current Fiscal Year (7/1/23 – 9/30/23):
 - Previous Fiscal Year reviewed during Annual Corporate Meeting
 - Balance Sheet -
 - It was noticed that the balance in the General Checking Acct was too high beyond FDIC limits.

- Discussion was held and the Council agreed to transfer some money to interest-bearing accounts:
- Income / Expense Statement discussed details around line items which showed significant increase or decrease.
 - Chris Frontale prepared a 2-page summary of key line items but also distributed a 6-page line item report; good discussion on key items of expense.
 - The council appreciated the presentation.

Review of Current Year -Collections and Attendance:

- Our budget of \$486,000 (Regular Sunday + online contributions) is down from last year's \$495,000.
- collections vs budget is negative for 1st 13 weeks, but better than last year at this time.
- Avg attendance is holding at about 404 per weekend, a bit up from last year.
- Mass streaming usually has about 15 20 viewers.
- overall, we are doing OK
- All Financial Statements unanimously approved during the Corporate Meeting
- Catholic Ministries Appeal Update:
 - St. John's target (not goal) for 2023-24 Campaign is \$81,000, down \$2,000 from last year.
 - As of 10/10/23 60 Donors have Pledged \$14,075, taking us to 17.38% of our Target.
- Buildings and Grounds Update discussion focused mainly on the results of previous work done by Elmer Davis Roofing under a \$16,500 contract to assess current condition and possible path forward:
 - Silo and Skylight:
 - After reviewing architectural drawings that were found at the Rectory, Flower City Glass said we could use current framework and just replace the "glass" panels.
 - Discussion at meeting centered on whether we should undertake the project:
 - Yes we should do it due to current and future danger presented by the leaks
 - No we should save the money and hold off until we know more from the Charlotte / Greece / Hilton Pastoral Planning Task Force

Skylight Walls

- Masonry contractor said the walls are in fairly good shape but could use some cleaning.
- The flashing between roof and silo wall appears to be in good shape so the flashing is probably not the source of the leak on to the Altar area.


