

We Believe that Faith is a Gift

As Catholics we believe that faith is a gift that we receive at Baptism and it grows within us as we live, learn, worship, and celebrate with our Christian family—THE CHURCH.

Faith is a powerful gift and Jesus in the Sacred Scriptures speaks about it very often. Faith the size of a mustard seed would be sufficient to uproot a sycamore tree and cast it into the sea Luke 17:6. Because of her faith, the woman who suffered twelve years from hemorrhages was healed simply by touching the tassel of the cloak Jesus was wearing Matthew 9:22. our Baptism. When we act out our faith, we grow in faith. As your Pastor, I am calling on all to act out in faith as we pray and reflect on the power and presence of God in our lives.

Faith is our response to this desire expressed in our religious practices and values we hold in life. Pastoral Planning:

Task Force Update

The Charlotte/Greece/Hilton
Pastoral Planning Task Force met on
May 31. This meeting was devoted
to a conversation with Shannon

Kilbridge, Associate Director of the diocesan Dept. of Pastoral Services. She gave the task force a broader view of the church in the diocese, across the U.S. and the world as well as models of parish leadership and parish configuration being utilized here and elsewhere. Shannon commended our parishes for being proactive in looking at our realities, communicating transparently with parishioners, and working collaboratively to plan for the future. Other planning situations have been directed by the diocese and often connected to an immediate lack of priest availability or financial issues. In contrast, this task force was convened following a discussion/conversation among the pastoral leaders of the 7 parishes. Shannon described pitfalls other groups have fallen into and suggested additional ways to communicate effectively with parishioners. Please Join Us for Our Parish Information Night for RCIA—Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Coming this Fall, 2023, St. John's will offer our parish RCIA Program led by Rick Paoletti and supported by our pastor, Fr. Peter. What is RCIA you may ask? RCIA is a process in which one discerns his/her desire to become a baptized and fully initiated member of the Catholic Church. RCIA is also a process for those who are already baptized Christians who are seeking to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist. Thirdly, RCIA is an opportunity for Catholics who are already fully initiated (Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation) in the Catholic Church who desire a deeper understanding of Catholic teachings.

By taking part in the RCIA program, one is not obligated to fulfill what the program's intended purpose is, however, it is our prayerful desire this will come to fruition. Therefore, we encourage you to come and gather more information and have your questions answered at our parish *Information Night for RCIA* taking place in our Parish Center on **Wednesday evening**, **August 23**, at 6:00 PM.
