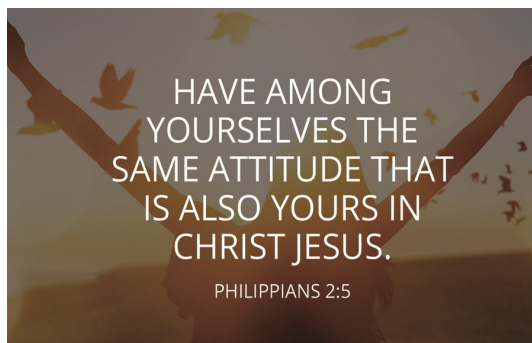

Nothing is Too Big for God

If you were to read the editorial pages of any newspapers in the country today, one would find a variety of opinions about many issues. Not everyone thinks the same way. The various opinions usually depend on the culture, religious traditions, or politics of the people in an area. The same can be said about Christians; we represent diverse groups of people. While we are many people, we are all one in Christ. However, as with us Christians, there are different spiritual ways to arrive at a place God wants us to be. Remember, like reading editorials, every day we are free to choose the attitude we will bring as Christians. This story that someone told me over 15 years ago is a blessing and a lesson for all of us.

"Two men went fishing. One was an experienced fisherman, the other wasn't. Every time the experienced fisherman caught a big fish, he put it in his ice chest to keep it fresh. Whenever the inexperienced fishman caught a big fish, he threw it back in the water. The experienced fisherman watched this go on all day and finally got tired of seeing this man waste such good fish. 'Why do you keep throwing back all the big fish you catch?' he asked. The inexperienced fisherman replied, 'I only have a small frying pan.' Such was his intention."

Sometimes, like that fisherman, we throw back the big plans, big dreams, big jobs, great



opportunities that God gives us. Our faith is too small. We

laugh at that fisherman who didn't figure out that all he needed was a bigger frying pan; yet how ready are we to increase the size of our faith? What specific effort do we take in that direction? How is our church important to us in our

everyday outlook of things? How do we grow in the faith? We should not be afraid to be open and vulnerable to the Holy Spirit working in us. If we do, we will see God's power more clearly, and readily invite him into our heart. Each of us is called to be a disciple of encouraging words. Each of us is called to be a disciple of prayer. Each of us is called to be a disciple of charity, willfully giving of our time, talent, and treasure to support the Church. Each of us is called to be a disciple of welcome to the holy people who come to us, who are sent by God, to lead, challenge, and call the world to Christ. One thing that everybody in the world wants and needs is friendliness. It is by our work and support that we, ourselves, are active and vibrant in the ministry of the Church. Whether it's a problem or a possibility, God will never give us anything bigger than we can handle. That means we can confidently walk into anything God brings our way. We can do all things through Christ Philippians 3:13. Nothing is too big for God.

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Mission Appeal Coming Up NEXT Weekend July 25/26, 2026

Each year parishes throughout the Diocese of Rochester hold their Mission Appeal Weekend and here at St. John's we will do so NEXT weekend of July

25/26. This year St. John's has been assigned the *Catholic Diocese of Obuasi in Ghana*. Coincidentally the international theme coincides with our Filipino Festival on July 26. Many of us are familiar with Obuasi Diocese in Ghana (Fr. Peter's home country) based on visits from Bishop John Afoakwah and many priests from that diocese who have visited us at St. John's over the past years and have assisted Fr. Peter during times when he returned home for respite.

The information below provides some preliminary information and more will be shared when Fr. Peter Nkansah speaks to us on this Mission Appeal Weekend. We look forward to receiving Fr. Nkansah and our generous support is encouraged and will be of great benefit.

Catholic Diocese of Obuasi, Ghana

The Catholic Diocese of Obuasi is comparatively young Diocese in Ghana, West Africa. It was created on March 3, 1995. It is a predominantly rural Diocese with poor road network and mainly peasant farmers who live from hand to mouth. It has a growing Catholic population of about 121,466 being 8.2% of the area population (2018) Local priests - 105; Religious priests - 6; Religious brothers - 8; Catechists - 800; Parishes - 45; Major Seminarians 50; Females Religious Groups 8 with 31 Sisters (Nuns). Every parish church has a mission church attached to it. On the average every church has about 10 mission churches. Total mission churches is about 450.

Challenges Facing the Diocese:

1. Formation and training of 50 major seminarians costs \$1,500 for each seminarian annually
2. Training of catechists cost about \$500 each and we have a little more than 800 catechists
3. Training of Sunday School Teachers and Missionary Animators cost about \$5,000
4. Drilling of Wells for village churches costs \$5,000 for a well
5. Roofing of poor and needy Village churches cost a minimum of \$10,000 per church (rafters, roofing sheets and skilled labor costs); Some of our mission churches have Masses in classrooms.

Getting Underway Now with Faith Formation & Sacramental Preparation Registrations—2026-27 School Year

If you are new to our parish or have been here and your children are now of the age to begin Faith Formation and/or Sacramental Preparation, the following information is for you.

FAITH FORMATION for Grades K THRU 7:

(FEE: \$50 for one child/\$70 for two children/\$80 for three or more children). Now is the time to register your children for our Home Schooling Program here at St. John's. If you did not attend one of the summer Faith Formation sessions at one of our neighboring parishes, please be sure to register here at our parish for our 2026-27 Faith Formation Program. Please know that Faith Formation and Sacramental Preparation are two different programs, each with their own study & their separate registration form & fee, therefore, children who are of the age to receive First Penance and First Eucharist, need to be registered for **each** program. Sacraments are to be prepared for and made at one's home parish.



FIRST PENANCE

AND FIRST EUCHARIST:

(FEE for EACH Sacrament: \$25 for one child/\$40 for two children/\$50 for three or more children). If you have a child entering 2nd grade or if he/she is

older and has not yet made these sacraments, now is the time to register.



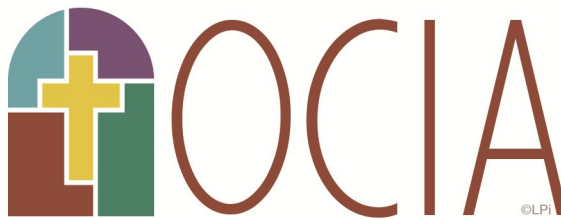
CONFIRMATION:

(FEE for the 2 year program: \$75 for each youth). This is a 2 year program for youth entering grade 8 or higher this Fall.

How to Proceed: Faith Formation AND Sacramental Preparation registration forms are available on the table in the Narthex in the back of church by the center doors OR at the Parish Office. **Please complete the necessary form(s) and submit it along with your payment to the Parish Office by Sunday, August 23, 2026.** You can bring it to the Parish Office during office hours **OR** you can mail it to us at: St. John's Church, 2400 West Ridge Road, Rochester, NY 14626 **OR** you can place your registration form(s) and check into the weekend collection basket. Please be sure it is in a sealed envelope marked: **Faith Formation/Sacrament Registration.**

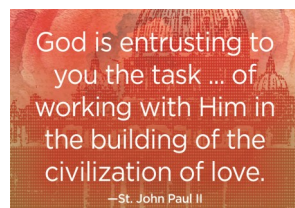

Update from the ROC Catholics Northwest Vocations Committee

An interview with lay ecclesial minister, Mary Toot (Interim Multi-Parish Director of Faith Formation for Holy Cross, Our

Mother of Sorrows, St. Charles Borromeo and St. Lawrence)

How did you prepare for your role? What training did you receive? My experience started immediately with Vacation Bible School for approximately 100 children.

The person whose job I was taking stayed on to mentor me for the first few months, and I followed closely what she had done before me. Also, the Diocese of Rochester has a Department of Evangelization and Catechesis that offered workshops, training, and monthly meetings to help catechetical leaders to stay current with curriculum and sacramental preparation programs that the Bishop has endorsed.

What is your advice to others thinking about a similar path? If you ever think to yourself "I bet I could do that," you should listen because it's probably the Holy Spirit whispering in your ear! Also, if someone says to you, "I bet you would be good at that job," again you should really consider it! Working to help children learn about Jesus, to help the children's families learn more about their faith is a wonderful way to spend your life!
