We Believe that Faith is a Gift

As Catholics, we believe that faith is a gift that we receive at Baptism and it grows within us as we live, learn, worship, and celebrate with our Christian family—THE CHURCH. Faith is a powerful gift and Jesus in the Sacred Scriptures speaks about it very often. Faith the

size of a mustard seed would be

sufficient to uproot a sycamore tree and cast it into the sea Luke 17:6. Because of her faith, the woman who suffered twelve years from hemorrhages was healed simply by touching the tassel of the cloak Jesus was wearing Matthew 9:22. Sight was restored to some who were blind, because of their faith Matthew 9:29, and the faith of the men who lowered their friend through the roof brought healing and forgiveness to their paralyzed companion Mark 2:5.

We cannot take the gift for granted. It was in his own hometown of Nazareth that Jesus was distressed by the lack of faith found in his people Mark 6:6. We may profess our faith each week in



against just reciting words. Jesus criticized those who performed acts of prayer, fasting, or charity in order to appear holy; our actions should flow from the faith we profess right from the time of our Baptism. When we act out our faith, we grow in faith. This weekend, as your Pastor, I am calling on all to act out in faith

as we pray and reflect on the power and presence of God in our lives.

God continually draws us to himself and has written in our hearts a deep desire for communication with him. Faith is our response to this desire expressed in our religious practices and values we hold in life. It is in our faith relationship with God that In him we live and move and have our being Acts 17:28. Faith is a gift from God—a response from us to God. I am thankful to God



for your faith and generosity to our Beloved Saint John's.

Preparing for Mass

How do you prepare for Mass? Coming to celebrate Mass and receive Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist should be something we look forward to with great anticipation and reverence—after all, as Catholics, we know this to be the GREATEST GIFT of all. We hear this, we read this, but do we really believe in this, cherish this, and show respect for Jesus present to us Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity?

Let's take some quiet time this summer to reflect on the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist. Simply ask the Holy Spirit to open your heart and gift you with a deeper understanding of Jesus in the Eucharist, allowing you to grow in your faith. After getting started with this, don't let it end there; keep your prayers going. A good way to continue this is preparing yourself for Mass each week and for some, each day as daily Mass attendees. Preparing for Mass can and should begin at home during the week leading up to weekend Mass culminating when you arrive early for Mass. We all recognize the busyness of daily life, running here and there, doing this and that, fulfilling this commitment and that commitment, but when it comes time to preparing ourselves for Mass, how much time do we



dedicate to this? If we are to be honest with ourselves, probably not much time, if any at all, and why so?—after all, we are about to receive the GREATEST GIFT of all.

Let each of us commit ourselves to arriving for Mass at **least** 15 minutes before Mass begins to dedicate this time to God, and to God alone.

We know how good it is to see our friends and family when we arrive at church each week and it's easy to use this time for friendly conversation. The intention of doing this is good but let us remember there is a time and place for everything. When we come for Mass, once we enter God's house of worship (Nave and Sanctuary), He is our priority, thus the One we devote our time to with prayerful preparation before the Blessed Sacrament as we will soon draw near to receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. We respectfully ask that quiet socialization take place in the narthex/vestibule with the inside doors closed to maintain a quiet, prayerful atmosphere in the church Nave (the part of the church where the congregation sits).

Let's see how our Faith in Action, by the power of the Holy Spirit, allows us to grow in our understanding, love and respect for the Eucharist.

Be Aware of Scams

Unfortunately we live in a world that has its fair share of those who wish to take advantage of people and here at St. John's, we are not exempt from these unscrupulous people. We strongly encourage you to be very mindful of text messages and/or e-mails that claim to be from Fr. Peter. Many of you have been recipients of these scam notifications and many of you have contacted the office and/or Fr. Peter to see if it is legitimate. THEY ARE NOT! Fr. Peter does not randomly send e-mails and/or text messages to parishioners asking for help.

If at any time you are uncertain/skeptical of a communication you receive, DO NOT respond to it and DO NOT click on any link it asks you to connect with until you have determined it is indeed legitimate. Again, most times they are not. If you receive an e-mail claiming to be from Fr. Peter, please check the e-mail address it is coming from and that will be your best defense. If you are unsure, please contact the Parish Office to check on it further. Nowadays these e-mails and text scams look very official when, in fact, they are not, so please take time to look them over carefully. If you are unsure, please call us and/or check with a family member and/or trusted friend to guide you.

Martha's Burdens

It's time to admit it: I've been unfair to Mary in the past. Been a little catty about her. Oooh, Mary, she's so holy. Well, do you like to eat, Mary? Who made your lunch? Yeah, that's right: it was Martha. Because you know what? It's the Marthas who get things done in the world while the Marys lounge around reading Aquinas and attending silent retreats and going to Eucharistic Adoration whenever they want.

And there you have it, folks: my bitterness on full display! I tend to identify with Martha, not with Mary, and I need to stop doing that.

Because I am not Martha instead of Mary. I am both. We are all both.

Mary was a woman; she was expected to do the serving, too. She shared that burden; she wasn't abandoning it, heaping her portion on Martha. And it's so wrong to assume that Mary didn't have the same cares and anxieties as Martha — perhaps she even had more! Here's the difference: Mary, unlike Martha (and me, I guess) knew where to go with them.

We typically see our burdens as an impediment to a relationship with Christ. I'm so busy. I'm so overwhelmed. There are so many demands on me, on my time, on my person, on my finances. Take a number, Jesus. Get in line. But we're thinking the wrong way. Burdens aren't an obstacle that stands between us and Christ. Burdens are the straightest path to his feet.

God knows about burdens, okay? Aside from being allwise and all-knowing, he basically completed a doctorate in suffering, taking on a human form (itself kind of a burden, if you think about it) and for 33 years lived among the hardest and heaviest burdens this world has to offer.

Why did he do this? Well, part of the reason was so that we could finally understand that our burdens aren't a barrier between us and God. On the contrary, they connect us to him.

Are you anxious about many things? Then you need to be right where Mary is: at the feet of Jesus, with all your burdens. ©LPi

All registration forms should be completed by Friday, August 22. For additional information you can contact Cris Simone.




Saints Joachim and Anne, are the parents of the Virgin Mary. There are no mentions of them in the Bible or Gospels. What we know comes from Catholic legend and the Gospel of James, which is an unsanctioned, apocryphal writing from the second century AD.

There are about 150 copies of the ancient manuscript which often have different titles, but tell the same story, that Mary was promised to Joachim and Anne by an angel, was consecrated to God, and she remained a virgin all her life.

Naturally, there is plenty of room for scholarly debate about these saints. We have no true primary sources that prove they even existed, but certainly we can agree that Mary had parents. Likewise, we can agree that, Mary had good, faithful parents who raised her with a love and devotion to God like none other except Jesus Christ Himself.

Joachim and Anne serve as role models for parents and both deserve to be honored and emulated for their devotion to God and Our Lady Mary, the Mother of God.






