### The Mass— Why Do We Sit & Kneel?

**WHY DO WE SIT AT MASS?** We sit for the readings and the homily. We sit for the preparation of the gifts and a moment of silence after communion. Why? We sit so we can listen and be attentive. We “take the load off of our feet” in order to ponder the goodness and mercy of God in our lives. But we must be careful that our sitting doesn't lull us to sleep. In our culture today, we sit when we want to be passive or entertained. We sit to watch television. We're quiet then and not involved much. That's not the kind of sitting liturgy needs.

**WHY DO WE KNEEL?** We kneel sometimes to beg for mercy or ask the saints to pray for us or the Holy Spirit to come down upon us. Humility



is the very foundation of prayer. Without it, pride gives way to envy that, in turn, keeps us from acting charitably toward others. We need to train ourselves in humility by directing our attention to our utter dependence on God. Kneeling is the posture of a servant, of someone in need—someone in need of prayer.

Our postures are an important part of our prayer. Let's use them with care

at Mass and in our prayer at home, too. Being a Christian is not a hard thing to be, but living a Christian life can be very difficult. For this reason we must humble ourselves; “decrease so that

Christ may increase in us.”

### 5 Flag Trivia Questions

*Quiz your friends and family with these five flag questions and answers:*

- 1. Is it ever appropriate to fly the flag upside down?** Answer: Yes, but only in an emergency. It means “Help Me! It's an emergency! Call the police! I am in dire trouble and need immediate help!”
- 2. How many versions of the American flag have been designed?** There have been 27 versions of the American flag. However, the current flag—designed by a high school boy—has lasted the longest as no states have been added since 1959.
- 3. Can the flag touch the ground?** Despite the myths, the flag can touch the ground and still be washed and used. However, if the flag is torn or damaged beyond repair, the tradition is to burn it with dignity. Most U.S. localities offer this service at no fee.
- 4. How many U.S. flags made it to the Moon?** The U.S. flag has been placed on the Moon by an astronaut during six Apollo missions (11, 12, 14, 15, 16, and 17).
- 5. Why must Old Glory be folded in such a specific way?** The U.S. flag is folded into a small triangle made of 13 folds. Each fold has a special meaning and symbolism. For example, the first fold represents life, while the third honors the veteran who has departed, and the fifth is a tribute to our country.

Next time you gaze upon the symbol of the nation's freedom, pause and reflect on the flag's origins, symbolism, and history—and what the American flag means in your life.

## Diocese of Rochester Permanent Diaconate

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and

social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church.

The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at [edward.giblin@dor.org](mailto:edward.giblin@dor.org), for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry.

Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate.

The Diocese anticipates that the next formation class will begin in Fall 2027, with the application process beginning in early 2027.

### Catholic Etiquette

#### The Importance of Dressing for God, not the Culture

Every now and then it's good to remind ourselves of some important matters surrounding Catholic etiquette. We ask that each of us respectfully and prayerfully reflect and act upon this topic as it pertains to us individually. We are not here to chastise and condemn but to remind us and guide us along the right path so we grow in holiness and offer all due reverence to our Triune God – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. At the same time, we ask parents to guide their children along the right and respectful path so they understand why we are called to abide by the following:

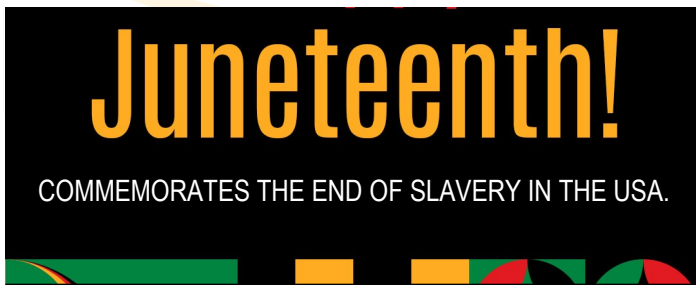


#### *Dress modestly and appropriately before the Lord.*

Yes, when one comes to Mass he/she is always in the presence of the Lord. Dressing immodestly can be an issue year-round but moreso in the summer months when the days are warm and sometimes hot. We can probably all agree our society has changed in regard to its attitude on proper attire. What was once the norm is no longer. This is the case not only with everyday attire but also with respect to proper church attire. No doubt we all like to feel comfortable but this should not be the primary focus when it comes to deciding what we will wear when coming to church. While the Catholic Church does not have dogmatic teaching on modest dress, it exhorts us to use common sense. If we are invited to a gala event, we don't dress like we were invited to a beach party. Christ himself has invited us to partake in the sacred banquet of the Eucharist. Should not our attire and our reverent actions reflect where we are and who we are in the presence of? When it comes to being in the presence of the Lord, reverence should be **...reverence should be paramount**.

Clothing should not be a needless distraction for our brothers and sisters in Christ at Mass (and yes, this includes priests and deacons who are not immune to distraction), therefore, both men and women should avoid tight or form-fitting clothing. For men, women and children, shorts are not proper attire in church. The hope is that wearing pants for the hour or so we are in church will not present a burden for anyone. For women, low-cut tops should be avoided. Dresses and skirts should be knee-length or longer and dresses should not expose a woman's back or shoulders although wearing a shawl/sweater while in church can overcome this issue.

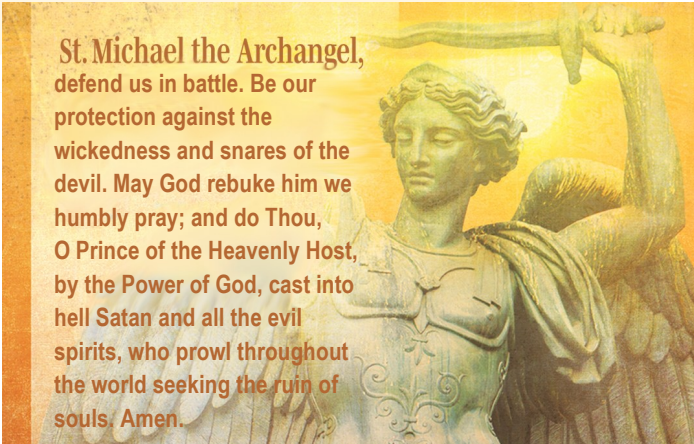

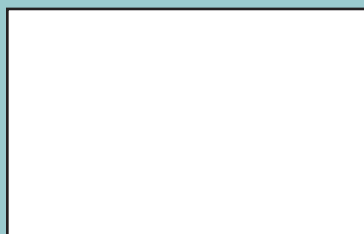
