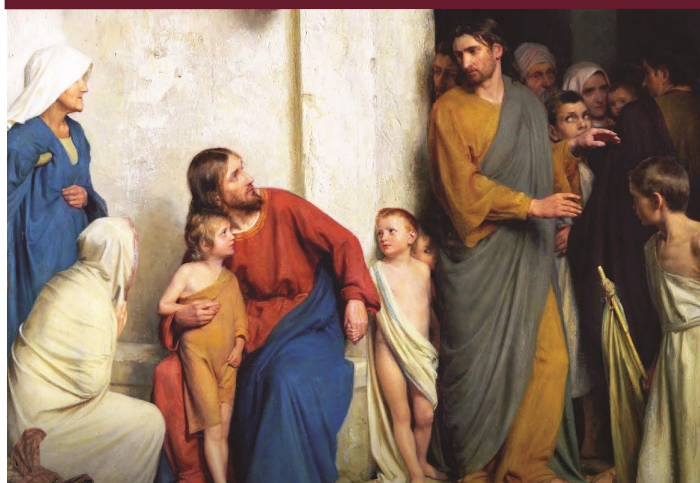

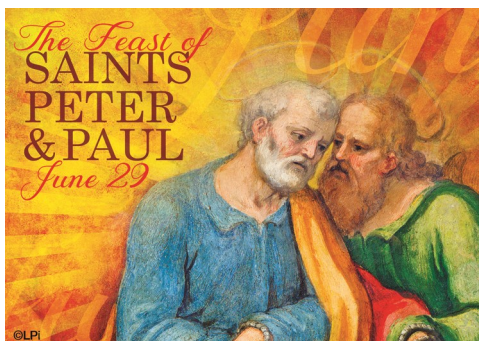
Sts Peter & Paul— Commitment to Christ and Our Faith in the Lord

If you have been to Rome, the excavations under St Peter's Basilica are one of the most interesting parts of any visit to the Holy City. As you enter the long passageways directly under the basilica, you descend down through several layers of history until you finally arrive at what is usually referred to as the Necropolis or the City of the Dead. Passing through its narrow damp and dark streets, you finally come to a small cavity there, and scratched on the stone in Latin are the words:

Here is Peter. Here, according to tradition, Peter, the fisherman and prince of the Apostles is laid to rest.

Peter is mentioned more than any other apostle in the Gospels. We hear again that the significance of Peter is made clear as he is declared the Rock upon which the Christian community will be built and he is entrusted the keys to the kingdom of heaven. We know the character of Peter, impulsive, the one who speaks first and thinks later; the one who despite all his bravado ends up denying Jesus three times and finally deserting him at the time of great need.

Contrast is the word that comes to mind when we think and reflect on the lives of the two saints we celebrate this week. Paul was once called Saul, the zealous Pharisee who persecuted the early Church, seeking to silence the spread of the Gospel message. Yet, God used him; by his conversion he became the fearless preacher of the Gospel. Paul tells us in his letters to the various Christian communities about how the Lord has been by his side, giving him strength to complete the task of preaching the Gospel. He has faith that the Lord will rescue him from all harm and bring him safely into the heavenly abode.



Discipleship of Jesus Christ takes on many forms. Many times, we limit our vision of discipleship to the work of priests and nuns or the obviously involved lay men and women of the Church. But each and every disciple of Jesus Christ is formed and supported by a network of others who are also disciples. It is by the work and

sacrifice of all of them, based upon their deep love for Christ, that the Gospel message of Jesus is preached, lived out, and expanded around the world.

Each of us is called to be a disciple of encouraging words. Each of us is called to be a disciple of prayer. Each of us is called to be a disciple of charity, willfully giving of our time, talent, and treasure to the support of the Church. Each of us is called to be a disciple of welcome to the people who come to us, who are sent by God to lead, challenge, and call the world to himself. It is by our work and support that we, ourselves, are active and vibrant disciples.

By acknowledging Peter and Paul in this solemn feast, we are recognizing our roots in the Christian Church, and we remain connected to them. Through the centuries, the Catholic faith has spread and evangelized people through all parts of the world. Each of us has a part to play in evangelization. It is through our own personal discernment and prayer that we come to know just what our role is to be. You may be surprised at the variety of ways we can share the Lord with our St John's faith community. Evangelization continues through our own kind words and actions. There is much to be done, so waste no time in getting started.

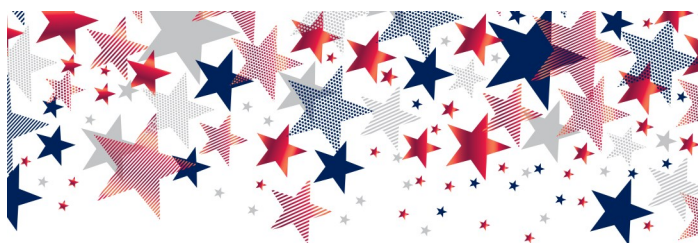

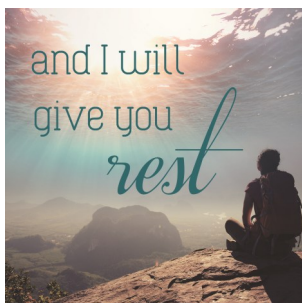

- **May Coffee Hour** was on May 17, hosted by the Fatima Ladies and Prayer Shawl ministry. I thought they did a wonderful job.
- **DAY OF CARING** The Day of Caring was held on Saturday May 9. We had approximately 18 people that day and the DUMPSTER was filled. Hot Dog Lunch was held when the work was completed and can venture to say that a few recliners were used later in the day. We are considering one in October as well.
- **PROCEDURES/BACKUPS** I am basically done with this project. I did not get responses from every ministry, but I am handing in the final product.

DEACON LON SMITH UPDATE:

- I may be able to have Dr. Honey Meconi, from the University of Rochester come to SJE to present the medieval mystic *Hildegard of Bingen*.
- **The Children's Library** is an extreme success with books, and due to the generosity of others, many other items were able to be purchased as well.
- **Bereavement Group** has been rescheduled from June 17 to June 24
- **Call for Social Justice Ministry** to get other people in the parish to work with the poor
- **Cursillo** need to be pushed to make others aware
- At the end of May there was a presentation about Joan of Arc
- December 10 there will be a presentation on St. John the Beloved at St. Bernards

FATHER PETER'S UPDATE:

- We made a lot of progress with this most recent CMA campaign reaching our goal in spite of losing a lot of parishioners. Our next CMA goal will drop a little. We have been welcoming many visitors at Mass and we're

trying to get them to stay here with us at St. John's.

- A Filipino Festival will take place on July 26 hosted by our newly formed Filipino Ministry.
- A dinner here for the bishop and priests will take place this weekend.
- There are many areas in the US that are closing parishes due to a decline in attendance, lack of priests, and maintenance of church properties. We have a part to play by looking for ways in which to welcome people back to church. Catholic schools are closing. Failure does not mean we aren't trying; it means we need to keep trying. We have seen some young folks return to church but we want to see more. Thank you for all you have done and continue to do. Bob Gotham has been our PPC Chairperson for a long time and this is his final meeting in this role. We need to support his replacement.

Social Committee: We had our parish picnic, about 100 people attended and we were able to have most of the picnic outside with games and food. Lots of volunteers showed up to help. Ideas were submitted for events next year. Thank you to all who participated and helped. Some of the events in the past year that the committee planned and executed were:

- June 2025- pancake Breakfast
- October 2025 -Octoberfest
- December 2025- reception for music ministry concert
- February 2026 - hosted a coffee hour
- March 2026 - Easter Egg Hunt
- June 2026 - Aloha parish picnic

Arts and Environment: We would like to do a deep cleaning of the church in the fall, including washing down the pews, candelabras, etc).

Knights of Columbus: Knights of Columbus: Corpus Christi procession at Mother of Sorrows this past Saturday, Yesterday was the first chicken BBQ of the summer at MOS, this Saturday they will be cooking for the priests at St. Johns, Then the annual picnic, the Rosary at Planned Parenthood, and Red Wings game on July 19th.

Liturgy Committee: nothing new to report. There are several sick/homebound parishioners that are visited each week.

Food Drive: Pam | Next food drive is scheduled for June 20-21 with delivery on Jun 22. Pastoral Planning: From the ROC Catholics Northwest Vocations Committee: An interview with lay ecclesial minister, Patty Gorman, Music and Liturgy Director at St. Leo the Great

What do you do? I direct a Worship Group, Festive Choir, Children's Praise Choir, Resurrection Choir, and Cantors. In addition, I oversee the Hand Bell Choir. I am also in charge of all liturgical happenings and liturgical purchasing, such as hosts, candles, banners, and flowers. What is your advice to others thinking about a similar path? Pray about it, volunteer first like I did, and shadow people in the music or liturgy area at church. The pay isn't for the faint of heart, and the work calls you to go above and beyond. If you decide to go in this direction, I suggest that you attend Pastoral Musicians conventions like I did. I learned a lot at the conventions and met composers and liturgists of all kinds. 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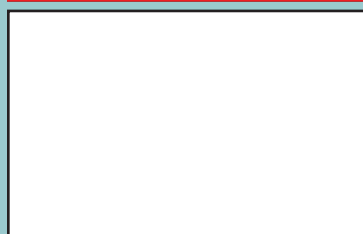
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
