



Beautiful Words to Ponder for Lent


Lent is about us and our journey of faith. It is about God and us. It is a time of renewal to fast, pray and give alms. We are invited to draw from the source of our baptism, the grace within and allow Christ to revive us.

Scripture says, "Let us search and examine our ways that we may return to the Lord. Let us reach out our hearts toward God in heaven!" Lamentations 3:40-41.

The whole idea of the season of Lent is to help us to improve, reshape, do more, and become better. I invite each one of us to use these beautiful words that follow, to do a self-evaluation toward a meaningful prayer life this Lent. We all need God's grace and love to renew ourselves in prayer, and it must be constant on our minds. Let us please ponder these words in order to improve our spiritual life and outlook.

Remember:

1. Prayer is not ONLY a "spare wheel" that we pull out when in trouble; it is a "steering wheel" that directs us in the right path throughout life. So pray always.
2. Why is a car's windshield so large and the rearview mirror so small? Because our past is not as important as our future. So look ahead and move on in your trust of God. Note our mistakes, change our ways, and trust in God.
3. Friendship is like a book. It takes a few seconds to burn, but takes years to write.



Keep the faith, no matter how alone one may feel at challenging times in one's life.

4. All things in life are temporary. If things are going well, enjoy it, they will not last forever. If things are going wrong, don't worry, they can't last long either. God is always there at your side.
5. Old friends are like Gold! New friends are Diamonds! If you get a Diamond, don't forget the Gold. As it is, to hold a Diamond you always need a base of Gold.
6. Often when we lose hope and think this is the end, God smiles from above and says to us, "Relax, it's just a bend not the end!"
7. When God solves our problems, we have faith in His abilities; when God doesn't solve our problems, He has faith in our abilities. Stand firm this Lent. We all need the grace to overcome our challenges.
8. When we pray for others, God listens to us and blesses them; so, sometimes when we are safe and happy, remember that someone has prayed for us.
9. Worrying does not take away tomorrow's troubles; it takes away today's peace. Enjoy the moment that God offers us. Knowing that the Lord of all creation, who considers us so important, can strengthen us in the battle against temptation. Have a peaceful season of Lent.

To Be a Bishop is to Serve as a Modern Day Apostle, Entrusted with the Teaching Mission of the Church

As we, here, in the Diocese of Rochester will soon welcome the Tenth Bishop of Rochester, Bishop John S. Bonnici, we also stop and pause in gratitude for our retiring bishop, The Most Reverend Salvatore R. Matano, the Ninth Bishop of Rochester. This is a special time for all in our diocese to celebrate these two men, called by God to the holy priesthood and subsequently appointed as bishops; successors to the Chair of St. Peter.

Bishop Matano has served us, the flock of this diocese, since his Installation as the Ninth Bishop of Rochester on January 3, 2014, succeeding Bishop Matthew H. Clark, of blessed memory. Over these 12 years there have been many hills and valleys for Bishop Matano to navigate and no matter the situation, God has carried Bishop Matano through it all. We are grateful for his steadfast and prayer-filled ministry and now it is time to wish him the very best as he soon enters this new season of life called retirement. 
daily prayers; it goes without saying, he will be very grateful for them.

The Solemnity of St. Joseph

On March 19th, we celebrate the holiness in the midst of unpredictable fatherhood. We first meet Joseph when he discovers his betrothed is pregnant ...and not by him!

St. Joseph does not know who the father is (yet), but he knows

the punishment for adultery is death. He decides to divorce Mary quietly, and thus save her life. When an angel appears to reveal that Mary is pregnant by the Holy Spirit, St. Joseph trusts his dream and marries her. As a new foster father, Joseph must help his wife give birth in a stable. Later, he needs to escape the threats to his son's life by immigrating with his family to a foreign land. We know that St. Joseph is faithful, brave, and willing to sacrifice for those he loves. On the solemnity of St. Joseph, we don't merely celebrate a carpenter. We celebrate a hero!



Next Mass Book Opening Wednesday March 25, 2026

The next time for scheduling Mass Intentions here at St. John's will begin by telephone on **Wednesday, March 25, 2026, from 9 AM till 1 PM**. This will include scheduling Masses during the months of May, 2026 through August, 2026.

Please know that this is not the only day you can call to schedule but it is the first day you can begin scheduling. This first day, March 25, will be by telephone only (please, no walk-ins on this first day). After March 25, you may call or stop at the Parish Office during office hours to schedule.

We will follow the same guidelines with the scheduling of 1 or 2 Masses. If you are looking to schedule 2 Masses, please know that **at least one** of the two will need to be scheduled at an 8:15 morning Mass. While we try to accommodate your Mass date requests, this is not always possible and we appreciate your understanding and flexibility when necessary.

PLEASE NOTE: We still have unscheduled Masses for those who have received Mass Cards for their deceased relatives and/or friends. Please call the office to arrange for these Masses to be scheduled. If we do not hear from someone by April 10, we will go ahead and schedule the Mass(es) and you can look for it in the *Masses for the Week* section in our bulletin. Thank you.


