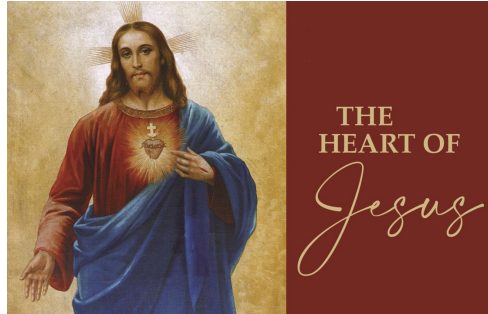
Welcome!

Passion Sunday/ Palm Sunday and Us

Today marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most significant week of the year for us Catholic faithful. Everything that Jesus said and did while on earth was leading up to this week, to the moment of the cross, the climax of God's great plan for humanity. So what better way to spend this week than to walk with Jesus through his Passion and Death?

Let us try to imagine ourselves in Jerusalem some two thousand years ago. Let us watch and celebrate as Jesus enters Jerusalem under showers of praise. Let us watch as he is anointed at Bethany and shares a final meal with his disciples. Now imagine as the Son of Man, our Savior is **betrayed...seized...and brought to trial**. See Jesus as being **falsely accused...then beaten...crowned with thorns...** and led up the hill to be **crucified**. In our imagination, let us keep watch as the veil of the Temple **tears...the rocks split...the graves open...and the dead rise**. Wow! Let us slowly take it all in and let it change our hearts, for that is the reason why we came here to Church today, and if we couldn't be here because of something, we should remember that this is why we call ourselves Christians. No one, however weak or imperfect, is denied a share in the victory of the Cross. Come home to your faith, come home to your church. *"Everyone who acknowledges me*



before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven." MT 10:21.

During this HOLY WEEK, let us take the time to solidify our faith in what Jesus has done for us.

Jesus has overcome **Satan, the devil, sin, and even death itself**.

All we need to do is offer our life to Jesus in deep gratitude for his gift of the Cross. Jesus' hearers may not turn away from the life he offers us if only we will come to him with a humble and open heart. However, for some of us, our minds are already made up and so we end up missing out on the Good News of his resurrection. Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for us on Good Friday. Just remember that Jesus loves us. Let this truth penetrate our heart so that praise and thanksgiving will well up from inside us; then be able to ask individually, *"What can I do as I live my life day to day in faith?"* We can resolve to be people of light taking our faith and trust in God into our homes, work-places, and to all we meet. We can step out in faith and say in God's justice, we are the prisoners set free, we are the blind whose eyes are opened, we are the poor hearing the Good News; all due to the fact that Jesus has freed us from the bonds of sin. May the prayer of praise of God well up in our hearts and strengthen us as we

gaze upon the Suffering Messiah on the cross.

Families Invited and Encouraged to Gather at Church on Good Friday at 3:00 PM

As we journey through Holy Week toward Easter, the Knights of Columbus, together with Fr. Peter, are encouraging everyone, especially **families**, in the parish community to attend the Good Friday Passion Service here at St. John's on Friday, April 3, 2026 at 3:00 PM.

The liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death reminds families of the suffering Jesus endured through his Passion and Resurrection, thereby opening the gates of heaven for each one of us.

It is our sincere hope and prayer that you and your families will join us.

Think About It, Pray About It, Join Us!

The chasm between man and his Creator is an ancient one, and it is driven deep and wide. But this week — this Holy Week — a bridge is built across the chasm.

And God reaches out His hand.



We hope you will join us as we celebrate this sacred time in our Church.

Tuesday, March 31 at 6:00 PM the *Chrism Mass* at the Cathedral will be celebrated by Bishop Bonnici. At this Mass, the Oil of Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick will be blessed, and the Oil of Chrism will be consecrated. Also at this Mass is when the priests renew the promises made on the day of their ordination and they recommit themselves to priestly service among the people of God.

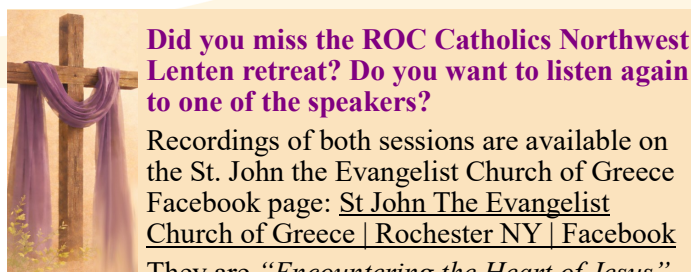
Holy Thursday, April 2 at 7:00 PM is the *Mass of the Lord's Supper*. Washing of the Feet will take place. Following Mass there will be **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament concluding with Compline (Night Prayer) at 10:00 PM.**

You are encouraged to spend some time before the Lord here at St. John's and/or one of our neighboring parishes.

Good Friday, April 3 at 3:00 PM we celebrate *Friday of the Passion of the Lord*. The Knights of Columbus, together with Father Peter, strongly encourage families to join us for this Service which marks the crucifixion and dying of Christ. On this day is when many Christians reflect upon Christ's sacrifice for their sins.

Holy Saturday, April 4 at 7:00 PM Fr. Peter will celebrate the *Easter Vigil Mass*.

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, April 5, Father Peter will celebrate Mass at 8:00 & 10:00 AM.

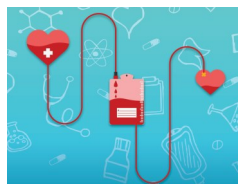

For those with Polish “roots” the word Swieconka may be very familiar but to those with little to no exposure to Polish tradition you may see this funny looking word and wonder what it’s all about. Read on

Swieconka means “the blessing of the Easter baskets”. It is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions on Holy Saturday during Easter. Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of boxwood, the typical Easter evergreen. Polish folks take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens, occasionally embroidered for the occasion, and boxwood and ribbon woven through the handle. Observing the creativity of other parishioners is one of the special joys of the event.

The three-part blessing prayers specifically address the various contents of the baskets, with special prayers for the meats, eggs, cakes and breads. The priest or deacon then sprinkles the individual baskets with holy water.

The foods in the baskets have a symbolic meaning:

Maslo (butter) – shaped into a lamb or a cross. Butter reminds us of the goodness of Christ.

Babka (bread) – a round loaf topped with a cross is symbolic of Jesus “Our True Bread of Life.”

Chrzan (horseradish) – Symbolic of the Passion of Christ.

Jajka (eggs) – Indicates new life and Christ’s Resurrection

Kielbasa (sausage) – Indicates God’s favor.

Szynka (ham) symbolic of great joy.

Sol (salt) – Jesus said “You are the salt of the earth.”

Candle – represents Christ, the Light of the world.

You are welcome to bring any food you plan on having at your Easter celebration to be blessed.

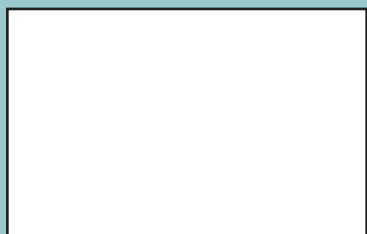
