Yes He Did, Jesus Wept

Today's Gospel is very comforting for us Catholic Christians on many levels. The raising of Lazarus from the dead is a fore-shadowing of what will happen to our Savior Jesus Christ on



Easter Sunday. The Catholic Church teaches us that one day our bodies and souls will be united with God in heaven. The raising of Lazarus gives us all hope of consolation and hope of rising.

The reaction of Jesus at the death of his friend Lazarus is also a source of consolation, especially when we too are grieving the loss of a loved one. We hear that Jesus was perturbed and deeply troubled. It states also that Jesus wept. We really need to pause and reflect on this for a moment on this Lenten journey as we carry our cross and try to follow in his footsteps. Jesus—the Son of God wept at the news of the death of his friend. Jesus wept despite the fact that he is all knowing and all powerful. He wept even though he knew he could raise Lazarus. This is quite remarkable and it can help us in our grief. So we often wonder, "WHY?" when someone dies, especially if it is a sudden death, a family member or a young person, we are shaken. We will not be able to answer this question, but we will know that Jesus is right there with us, weeping and experiencing our loss. We know Jesus shares our grief.

Our faith might be more conditional than we would admit. We may expect to magically solve all our problems perhaps by way of miraculous signs and wonders such as the sisters of Lazarus did. It is understandable, but that is not how faith works. It is not only about a miracle fix but rather about facing and solving life's challenges with confidence that we do not face them alone—that God is at our side. So rather than hope for a miracle today or tomorrow, work on resolving a problem ourselves, with the confidence and serenity that God is with us through it all. It is called faith, and in it, taking up one's cross to follow Jesus as a witness and testimony of his presence in our lives. When life troubles you and turns your life upside down, remember this too shall pass. What little things are you taking with you from your life? Select one

Chrism Mass Tuesday, March 26 6:00 PM

at Sacred Heart Cathedral

The Chrism Mass, which the bishop concelebrates with priests from various regions of the diocese and during which he

consecrates the sacred Chrism and blesses the other oils, is among the principal manifestations of the fullness of the Bishop's Priesthood and is considered to be a sign of the close bond of the priests with him. For it is with the sacred Chrism consecrated by the bishop that the newly baptized are anointed and those to be confirmed are signed. It is with the Oil of Catechumens that catechumens are prepared and disposed for Baptism. Finally it is with the Oil of the Sick that those who are ill are comforted in their infirmity.

 The Order of Blessing the Oil of Catechumens and of the Sick and of Consecrating the Chrism (OBO), no. 1

May our hearts turn to our gracious Lord who bestows His infinite love and mercy to us through these sacraments. Let us also pray for Bishop Matano, Fr. Peter and all the priests who are the ministers of the sacraments in the parish, that they may be humble and generous servants of the Lord.

All the faithful, including each of us from St. John's, are invited and encouraged to attend. Join with others from around our diocese for this most beautiful and sacred celebration during this very holy week.

This is a wonderful occasion that provides an opportunity for the lay faithful to experience the priests of our diocese gathered together with Bishop Matano and it is during this Chrism Mass that concelebrating priests renew the vows they took at their ordination.
