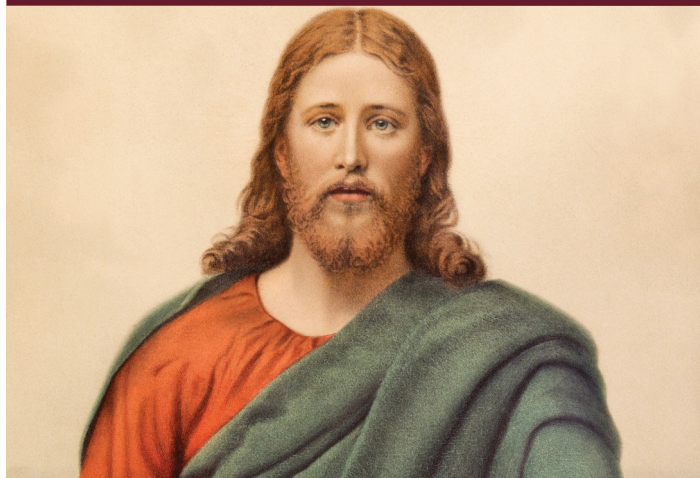

Be Sure to Know and Love Yourself

Sure, problems and pain may still come; yet, in the midst of these we can be confident that

Jesus will obtain for us all the resources we need.

Opening Prayer

Review Meeting Agenda - the following were distributed before the Meeting in order to provide information for discussions during the meeting:

- **Weekly Attendance and Collection Graphs** for 32 weeks of 2025 - 2026 – along with a graph of Total Surplus/Deficits by month
- **2-page Balance Sheet** as of 12/31/2025.
- **1-page summary of Actual Revenue / Expenses and Budgets from 7/1/25 thru 12/31/25.**
- **+8-page detailed Statement of Actual Revenue / Expenses and Budgets from 7/1/25 thru 12/31/25.**
- **CMA goal and actuals for 2025 – 2026 Campaign**
- **List of Capital Projects to be discussed and ranked**

Review and Approve Meeting Minutes (from previous meeting) – this was done before the minutes from our 10/1/2025 Meeting were published in Bulletin of 12/14/2025.

Collections & Attendance:

- **ATTENDANCE:** Our weekly attendance is also published in our Bulletin and has been fairly stable over the past 3 years. Our weekly Goal is 430, but 400 is a good week. Jerry Domink noted that online streaming of the Mass is double from last year – especially on those weekends showing low attendance.
- **COLLECTIONS:** Good news. As noted in the chart, weekly collections from 7/1/25 to February 2026 have been strong. This year's total Offertory collections (Sunday Envelopes + Online) have been about 15% over the previous year. It is clear that the Increased Giving Campaign has been successful.
- Also useful to note is that in FY2025-26 we have had 18 weeks in which we exceeded our weekly Budget (which was increased by \$600 per week over last year), and 18 weeks in which we did not. In the previous Fiscal Year we met our budget only 4 weeks out of 52.
- We have also noted an increase in Qualified Charitable Distributions from parishioners along with special "One-time-only" donations his year.
- We discussed whether we should note or comment in our Bulletin on the "special donations" (as MOS does) but we agreed to NOT do this.

Q2 25 – 26 Balance Sheet – continues to be strong, but note:

- The \$46,000 increase in total assets.
- The almost \$60,000 increase in Fund Balance (Assets over Liabilities).
- The '0' balance in the CD Account – this was because we closed out the CD and used 100k of the proceeds for the down-payment on the Silo Roof repair project. The remaining funds were transferred into the Money Market Acct.
- the 15% increase in the Communis Investment Balances. This increase is enough to cover the remaining balance on the Silo Repair.

Q2 25 – 26 Revenue vs Expenses– items to note:

- **Key question to ask** – do our regular collections cover Operating Expenses? We are in good shape at this time but there are extenuating circumstances:
- We show a news butting Revenue of \$13.7k and OVER-ALL net total revenue = \$40.2k.
- **Regular Collections** exceeded budget but other Revenue items, e.g., Fundraising are below budget.
- **Operating Expenses** are \$13,000 below budget mainly due to lower Building Maintenance expenses, but note the following:
- **Utilities** - Natural Gas is under budget but Electricity was over budget. A bad winter is hard to budget for, and rate increases are common. Bob Skrypek commented that some Churches move Daily Masses to other sites, e.g., Parish Halls and shut off heat during the day in the main Church. We do try to be frugal with our use of Utilities, but the Diocese negotiates the contracts with the Utilities.
- **Snow Removal** was under budget, but timing is everything – the balance on 12/31/25, of course, did not reflect high total charges of \$ 62,500 for Jan, Feb and March!!! We will re-bid the contract this summer. Our target is to keep the contract to \$35,000 / yr. Our current total budget is \$33k and this will be exceeded. As of 4/15/26 balance = \$72,700! Another point re: Snow Removal – we went with Trimline partly because they always have enough salt and they seem to take seriously their legal obligation in case of falls, etc.. This has to be considered additional "cost of insurance" when reviewing the contract.

CMA Update: *The parish met our goal with current donations – but the push is on to make sure all Pledges are met, and we had fewer donors this year.*

Buildings & Grounds/Capital Projects Review:

The one-page summary of known projects for Church, Rectory, Parish Center, and Grounds was discussed. Key items in order of need:

- **Silo Roof Repair** – total price is \$285k, and a \$100k downpayment was made (from our CD acct), and the work is scheduled for completion in Spring of 2026 with Elmer Davis.
- **Exterior Lighting** – Fr. Peter contacted our Electrician and he repaired the lights across the back of the parking lot! There are more lights to be repaired but this was a very good start. This issue is a safety issue!
- Overall physical security of the site – planning and analysis needed.
- **Church Roof** – it is under warranty until October 2026. It has leaked in the recent past and we have not had to deal with paying for an unwarranted repair. Even diagnosis of issues will be expensive because of the need for a high-lift Crane and other special equipment.
- **Insulate Rectory ceiling** to eliminate ice damming on the roof, and insulate outer South wall of Kitchen. Note: Fr. Peter said that the Rectory roof and gutters were replaced in 2015 for about \$26,000.

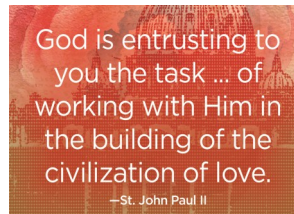
FINANCE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES *Continued from Page 4*

- **Parking Lot – reseal or repave?** It was last resealed/ restriped in 2024 at a cost of \$21,000 and was re-paved in 2018 at a cost of \$132,000.
- **Sidewalks** – many of them are crumbling from age and salt, but it is difficult to find the right contractors for the work.

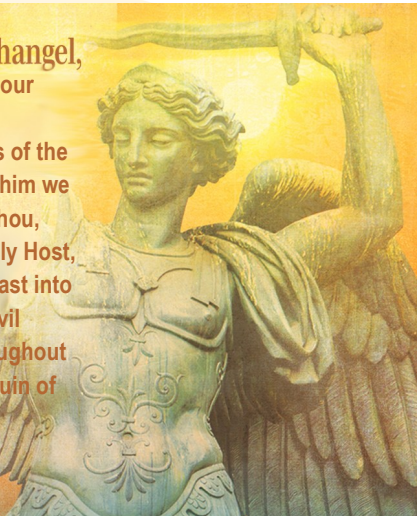
Vocations Committee: An interview with lay ecclesial minister, Donna Gray

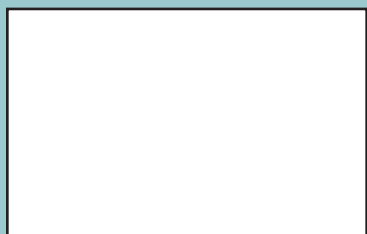
