

FATHER PETER'S UPDATE:

- We are celebrating the 160th anniversary of our church founding.
- Financial needs are necessary to sustain us into the future. We have a leaking roof and parishioners/donors are passing on. Our parish will need financial help as well as spiritual help.
- Our diocese is lacking in vocations to the priesthood; we are in much need. Many prayers are needed.
- Parish Pastoral Council Minutes need to be reviewed carefully for clarity and accuracy being sure to correct errors especially because these documents have been referenced in the past for auditing purposes and this could be needed again.
- \$80k is next year's CMA goal, which is a \$2k increase over this year.

The flyer for the tiles fundraiser and the LED panels that will allow these to be lit up was discussed. 





May 26, 2025 6th Sunday of Easter

I often lead group prayer with similar words: "Give us the wisdom to know Your will for our lives and the courage to follow it as we seek to make our community a clearer reflection of the Kingdom of God." The words acknowledge that we need to be about God's will, not our own, and in that journey, we will bear greater witness to the transforming power of Jesus Christ.

Rick Paoletti: a parishioner asked if it would be possible to live stream daily Mass? We do not have the volunteers to do that at this time.


Wayne Howard: really enjoyed the coffee hour, would have loved to be able to hear and learn more!
