

The Feast of Pentecost—Come Holy Spirit

Pentecost was originally a Jewish agricultural feast. It was celebrated fifty days or seven weeks after Passover and started as a feast of thanksgiving for the harvest. As it developed it also became a reminder and celebration of God's mighty deeds in the history of salvation. Today, we

celebrate the harvest of our faith and how it has been a spiritual nourishment during difficult and challenging days. The Feast we celebrate today gives us a chance to remember what God has done in the mystery of the life of Jesus Christ. We call this feast day the "birthday of the church" and we are the body who make up the congregation. The Spirit's signs and wonders we experience in our Baptism and Confirmation surround us and are in our midst every day. We have been strengthened by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and have become committed members who serve in ministry, full-time as well as the many volunteers. None of us has all the gifts needed to minister to this community or to address the needs of the world around us. But as a community we have seen and heard of the Spirit's gifts still being poured on those gathered in "one place together," as the disciples were on Pentecost, and we too, have on this day. The signs may not be as spectacular as wind, flames, and charismatic speech, but they are, nevertheless, part of the drama of the Acts of the Spirit that we read about this Pentecost Day. For among us here today are people who have been nourished by God's Spirit over a lifetime. We still believe; we are still yearning for God and we are still trying to be faithful to our commitments. In this fickle world where people walk away from

commitments they have made to church and family, the Church continues to proclaim in word and deed Christ's ongoing life among us. Once again in this faith community of St. John's, the Holy Spirit is lighting a fire that will fuel our faith. We also ask you to pray for our various committee representatives who make the running of this parish be collaborative in

ministry. This Feast of Pentecost is a major feast of the Church. It is so important because it is a celebration of the perpetual, powerful presence of God in and through the Holy Spirit in the Church. More than the fulfilled promise of Jesus, the Holy Spirit is the driving force of unity and evangelization in the Church. It is this force which unites all the followers of Jesus into his Body. It is this force which goes forth into the world to teach, challenge, convert, and bring peace. There are times in our lives when we feel weak and alone, when we lack confidence in our faith or in our Christian calling. Our Feast of Pentecost serves as a reminder to us that we are not alone—the Holy Spirit is with us.

When we open our lives to the power of the Spirit, great things will happen in us and through us. The Spirit can speak the truths of God through us if we give our VOICES. The Spirit can touch broken lives, heal divisions, and impart forgiveness if we give our HEARTS. The Spirit can lift burdens, dry our tears, and do great works of charity if we give our HANDS. 


Spirit to renew us, to rewind us, and re-create us in our faith.

Pastoral Planning:

The Charlotte/Greece/Hilton Pastoral Planning Task Force met on April 25th. The bulk of the meeting was devoted to discussing ways to keep the mission of our parishes front and center—especially in the

likelihood that the future will mean Pastors and Pastoral Administrators are increasingly appointed to lead multiple parishes. Members noted that all parishes have the same mission: to spread the Good News through Word, Worship, Community and Service. We will be exploring ways that leaders can empower lay people to take responsibility for increasing aspects of parish life. Two new committees with members from the 7 communities had their first meetings in early May: 1) exploring a shared website, and 2) evangelization. More information will be available as these groups continue their work.

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Chairperson's Comments:

- CMA UPDATE: For the CMA year we had 341 donors that averaged \$247 per donation. We have pledges of \$84,209.75 and we have collected \$80,669.75 of those pledges. So, we still need to collect \$3,500 in outstanding pledges by the end of MAY. And for Information purposes the Diocese is short \$345,000 of its goal. 42 parishes have met their goal. 14 parishes are in the 90 percentile and 33 parishes are under 90%.
- Day Of Caring: Is scheduled for Saturday May 20th (rain or shine), starting at 9:00 AM with Hot Dog Lunch at 12:00 PM.

- COFFEE HOURS: The Prayer Shawl Ministry is Hosted the Coffee Hour on April 16. I thought it went well. That is the last coffee hour for this year. I am glad they are back.
- June Picnic: Our NEXT meeting of the year is on Monday,
 June 5 and is basically our annual PICNIC with the Liturgy
 Committee. Nick Verdino volunteered to help with the cooking.
 Rick Paoletti has volunteered to organize the picnic. Rick will

 The Parish council will be responsible for set-up and the
 Liturgy committee will be responsible for clean-up, so that the
 Parish Council can conduct it's final meeting after the picnic (a

- Bob Gotham suggested to Father that we start offering the sign of peace again during Mass. Bob said that several parishioners have asked when it will return. Father started saying let us offer each other a sign of peace on Easter, so it is back! Bob encouraged the council to bring any suggestions we may have to Father and he will consider them.

Fr. Peter's Update: Thank you to all of you for everything you do for our parish. I have been with our Parish for 11 years now and my term will be up in 2024. Mickey was a foundation to this parish when I arrived, she opened and closed this Church every day. She did so many things for our parish and now we have a few parishioners who have volunteered to help fill in as her replacement but we need more. We have lost so many parishioners to non-denominational churches. We have so few families that attend weekly Mass, I don't know how to get people to return after Covid. We have tried Christ Life, and other ideas to try to get people to come back. Please pray for our church, bring a friend to Mass, pray for me personally. We are called to pray for ourselves, vocations, healing and the church that you love so much. If we want our church to be here then we have to actively participate. We will pray the Novena for 9 days in the

Month of May, we will pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit, to have peace, love and hope, and to bring people back to Mass and to increase vocations.
