The Feast of the Blessed Trinity

Anytime I think about this Feast of the Blessed Trinity, what comes to mind is the collaboration among the Father, the Son, and the Spirit. It also presents me with a mystery of my faith, the how, the why, and the challenges understanding the Trinity. Yet I see it is oftentimes good to contemplate the mystery of the Blessed Trinity and what it does to our own faith. Today we stand before the profound mystery of God: One God, Three Persons; a mystery that people have pondered on since the beginning of time. It tells about the awesomeness of God. In our daily meditation it presents the excellent relationship that there exists in the unity of the one Godhead. When we listen to the Scriptures we hear them as the one God speaking to us. We see people do things in the name of God, like those doing community service at our parish. We are lifting up the name of God in our relationship to God our neighbor.

I guess this encourages us all as Christians to try and help each other in building the Kingdom of God. Who is this God that we worship? What does divine revelation tell us through Sacred Scriptures, the wonder of creation, or the Holy Spirit speaking in the hearts of people? The sources of our faith tell us that God exists: *"I am who am"* Ex 3:15. God is eternal. God has always been. God will always be. They tell us that God is all-knowing. Wisdom and truth flow from God. *"God is love"* 1John 4:16. God is unity and community: a Trinity of Persons. This naturally flows from God's love. Out of his love flows great mercy.

To try and solve the unsolvable will only leave us frustrated and possibly unbelieving. The mystery of the Holy Trinity creates a dynamic relationship between God and us.

It encourages us to work together to foster the



unity of our faith in caring for one another. It enables us to ponder the mystery of God so as to stand in awe before God, worship God, and know God better. It enables us to ponder the mystery of God so as to know who God wants us to be, who God has made us to be. From Sacred Scripture we know that God permits our

pain, suffering, and any form of human grief. In our prayers for the sick, just as in our prayers for ourselves, we must trust the Triune God and trust, too, in the manner in which the Blessed Trinity may answer our prayers. Only then will we fully understand the power and possibility of prayer to God.

Both within our church and our community, we are called to be evangelizers who through our word and actions, give witness to our gracious God whose love "has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." We are called to share with others what we have personally come to know. Today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity. One way to do that is to celebrate the life of that Trinity in each believer and to respond with confidence to the call to proclaim God to all the world. We pray at this Eucharistic celebration that the Holy Spirit will teach each of us how to do that so that our beloved St John's here in Greece will better mirror what we profess. In the words of St Paul to the Romans 5:3-5, "not only that, but we boast of our afflictions, knowing that afflictions produce endurance, and endurance-proven character, proven character-hope, and hope doesn't disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." No matter how you feel, no matter what you are experiencing, you are



wrapped up in that love of God Almighty.

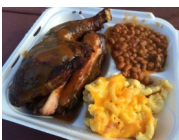

The Gift of Not Understanding

I once listened to Bishop Daniel Flores — a renowned scholar and prelate — give a 70-minute talk on the Trinitarian nature of God. In those 70 minutes, Bishop Flores said a lot of eloquent things. But what that really landed with me was not any group of words, but a single gesture.

Defining hypostasis, the term we use for the “the reciprocal dynamic relations that constitute distinct identities within the Godhead” (yes, I am using his words because I could never, in a million years, trust my own) Bishop Flores said “the Father and the Son are true God, but the Father is not the Son, and the Son is not the Father. How not? Different hypostasis.”

And here his eyes grew wide; he turned his head and opened his hands, drawing back as if from a spooked horse. The implication was clear: Any further than this, I dare not go.

I’ve never felt so seen.

Sometimes, I make the mistake of thinking that I am unique in my inability to understand the great mysteries. Sometimes, I despair that I am not a “better Catholic” — one who will rush headfirst into the crosshairs of a hard question, confident in the words that come immediately to my lips.

But when I saw Bishop Flores flinch at the thought of defining how, exactly, the Son is not the Father, and vice versa, I remembered that only fools rush in where angels fear to tread.

This Sunday, friends, take heart: our failure to understand is not a poverty. It is a gift. It propels us constantly back to the wellspring of our glorious Faith — to Scripture, to Tradition, to the in-dwelling of the Holy Spirit which sustains each and every one of us who dare to believe.

Chairperson's Comments:

- **CMA UPDATE:** Our Goal for this year is set at \$80,000, which is higher than last year.
 - # of Donors to date – 303- as of May 1, 2026
 - \$\$ committed to date - \$86,012.63
 - % of Goal – 107.52%
 - WE MADE OUR GOAL BY 12/23/25!!!!
 - Donors short by 7 from last year
 - The Diocese is at 104.05%, so we are ahead of the average.
 - We are averaging per donor \$283.87.
 - We still have \$845.59 in commitments to collect by May 30.
- **April Coffee Hour** was on April 19- hosted by the Knights. The Knights did a wonderful job.
- **Our May Coffee Hour** is on May 17- Hosted by the Ladies of Fatima and Prayer Shawl Ministries.
- **DAY OF CARING** The Day of Caring is scheduled for Saturday May 9 with a rain day of Saturday May 16. Sign-up sheet will be in the Narthex. We need at least 20 people to help and there will be plenty of work to do. Hot Dog Lunch approximately around 12:30. Currently we have only 16 people signed up to help.
- **BLOOD DRIVE** The blood drive was held on Saturday April 18. We had 35 donors.
- **PROCEDURES/BACKUPS** Initially, I requested Backup person names and procedures from 40 Ministries. I know there are more, but this task is pretty big and I know I will be requesting more.
 - **Ministry Backups** – I have received the names of 23 backup People. Still a lot to go.
 - **Event procedures** – I have received the procedures from 26 different ministries so far. I need some attention given to this from the leaders.
- **RocCatholicNW website** – we are still looking for a person from St. John's to review our content on this website and be willing to update it.
- **COLLECTION ENVELOPES:** Our vendor had a couple of issues. First, they had a machine breakdown and with that delay came a backlog of orders. Second, a machine had a broken part which had to be ordered and that also caused a delay and a backlog of orders. They are now back to being fully operational. Mother of Sorrows has a procedure that they have collected the parishioners email addresses, and they let them know via email if there will be an issue like this.

- **Certificate of Appreciation:** No nominations pending, currently.
- **Letters from the Bishops:** Read the letters, one from Bishop Emeritus Salvatore Matano and one from Bishop John Bonnici expressing their gratitude for the congrats and prayers from our parish.
- **June meeting/picnic:** Karen Bessette agreed to assist in organizing the JUNE picnic with the Liturgy Committee. She will send out the SIGN-UP GENIUS. You should plan on being here around 5:30.

DEACON LON SMITH UPDATE:

- **Children's library:** books are being collected to create a children's library. A bookshelf has been sourced. It will be located in the back of church and available to the children who attend mass.
- **Cursillo Retreat:** Next Cursillo Team Meeting is scheduled for May 28. I will be serving dinner to the team members at the St. John Parish Center as we plan for the next Men's weekend.
- **Women's Weekend** is May 14 -17 | **Men's** July 9-12 Held at Notre Dame Retreat House.

FATHER PETER'S UPDATE:

- We are in the process of getting new priest assignments, that may impair the ability to get substitute priests to cover vacations/time off.
- **The CMA** is over, and some parishes, including St John's, have outstanding balances to fulfill.
- **Church Attendance** has been dwindling and with the summer months coming we are hoping to see more people attending Mass. There are several encounters with young parishioners that give us the opportunity to engage these families, and we need to encourage them to keep attending Mass with us. We need to keep working diligently in this effort.

Paul Parkman would like to roll out the following to celebrate our 161st anniversary and simultaneous Footsteps of St. John celebration activities:

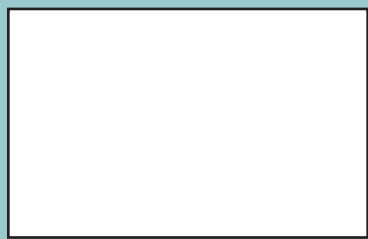
