

Is Our Faith Too Small?

If you were to read the editorial pages of any newspaper in the country today, you would find a variety of opinions about many issues. Not everyone thinks the same way. The various opinions usually depend on the culture,

religious traditions, or politics of the people in an area. The same can be said about us Christians; we represent diverse groups of people. While we are many people, we are all one in Christ. However, as with us Christians, there are different spiritual ways to arrive at the place God wants us to be. Remember, like reading editorials, every day we are free to choose the attitude we will bring to that as Christians. This story that someone told me many years ago is a blessing and a lesson for all of us.

"Two men went fishing. One was an experienced fisherman, the other wasn't. Every time the experienced fisherman caught a big fish, he put it in his ice chest to keep it fresh. Whenever the inexperienced fisherman caught a big fish, he threw it back in the water. The experienced fisherman watched this go on all day and finally got tired of seeing this man waste such good fish. 'Why do you keep throwing back all the big fish you catch?' he asked. The inexperienced fisherman replied, 'I only have a small frying pan,' Such was his intention."



Sometimes, like that fisherman, we throw back the big plans, big dreams, big jobs, great opportunities that God gives us. Our faith is too small. We laugh at that fisherman who didn't figure out that all he needed was a bigger frying pan; yet how ready are we to increase

the size of our faith? What specific effort do we take in that direction? How is our church important to us in our every day outlook of things? How do we grow in the faith? We should not be afraid to be open and vulnerable to the Holy Spirit working in us. If we do, we will see God's power more clearly, and readily invite Him into our heart. Each of us is called to be a disciple of encouraging words and of charity, willfully giving of our time, talents, and treasure to support the Church. Each of us is called to be a disciple of welcome to the holy people who come to us, who are sent by God to lead, challenge, and call the world to Christ. One thing that everybody in the world needs is friendliness. It is by our work and support that we, ourselves, are active and vibrant in the ministry of the Church. Whether it's a problem or a possibility, God will never give us anything bigger than we can handle. That means we can confidently walk into anything God brings



our way. We can do all things through Christ. Phil 3:13. God bless you all, Father Peter

As indicated by the recent numbers, there has been a fair amount of activity in CMA donations within our parish and we are grateful to those who have given generously. For those who have not yet contributed, we need everyone's support and hope that you will discern your appropriate level of support.

To consider your level of giving, first PRAY about it and then take a moment to reflect on what you gave last year. Ask yourself if there's any way you can increase that amount. Many times we will find it is possible to offer an



increased donation. Consider for a moment where we spend our money for the smaller things. If we were to forego our daily/weekly/monthly "simple pleasures", we might be surprised how the savings add up, allowing for that increase in giving this year.

Your pledge is due by the end of December. However, we remind you that

payment of your pledge is due at the end of May, 2024—appx $6\frac{1}{2}$ months from now. This means you can break down that pledge into 6 equal payments, making it a little easier for you to complete payment of your pledge.

The deeper issue is not really about the money, but our faith and the participation that flows from it. So, you are invited to consider ways you can respond with a grateful heart. In living this way, we demonstrate that we—"Go Forth with Christ"

Reminder on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to St. John's Parish

Under the legislation, donors aged 70½ or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA's directly to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transfer up to \$100,000 directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities. This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.
- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-fee treatment.
- The gift/check must be dated on or before Dec., 31, 2021 to qualify this year.
- The gift needs to be sent directly to the charitable organization which also has to be the payee for the gift.
