

Dying You Restored Our Life

As we are in the month of November, we see the beauty of the month in its wonderful shades of color and events. Let's take notice of what the month presents us spiritually and incorporate it in our prayer life. In the month of November we are called in a special way to remember our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection. In these coming days of Eucharistic

celebrations, we focus our attention on the communion of the saints. Almost everyone who has taught religion will tell you that sooner or later someone will ask why people suffer or die. To an eight year-old, and I guess even to an eighty year-old, it just doesn't seem fair that people who follow God's law and keep his commandments seem to undergo so many hardships in sickness and difficulties of death. Even Mary, the mother of Our Lord Jesus, honored as the highest of our race and preserved by God's grace and favor from sin, knew what it was like to have her heart pierced by the sword of sorrow. We are reminded that God loves us, even if our faith is lacking or weak. This coming Saturday, let us come together to celebrate our Annual Parish Memorial Mass at 10:00 AM. Let us come to remember our loves ones who have died, especially those we have lost so far this year. We will light a can-



dle in memory of each person. Come and let us pray for our loved ones.

We are required to complete the *pledge* phase of our campaign by year's end. But remember you have until May 31, 2026 to complete payment on your pledge.

Make a Gift to the CMA from Your IRA

A Special Opportunity for Those at least 70 ½ Years Old You can give any amount (up to \$108,000 for individuals and \$216,000 for couples in 2025) directly to the CMA without having to pay taxes on the amount as part of your annual income. Gifts of any value less than \$108,000 are eligible for this benefit and you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference for the Diocese of Rochester and your parish. This popular gift option is commonly called the charitable IRA rollover, and you may have seen it also referred to as a Qualified Charitable **Distribution (OCD).** If you are 73 or older and required to take minimum distributions (RMDs), a QCD can count toward your RMD obligation.

Your disbursement must come directly from the administrator of your IRA to the Diocese – you should not receive the funds first.

Dear Music Ministry and Parish Family,

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Jesus teaches us to pray with humility, which opens our hearts to our need for God. This is a call to self-examination, recognizing that true prayer comes from a place of humility and dependence on God, not self-congratulation. Our prayers and our lives should reflect a sincere and honest relationship with God, moving us to share God's goodness with the world because ~ "The Lord hears the cry of the poor."

The Litany of Humility is a Catholic prayer that the penitent be granted the virtue of **humility**. This *Litany* is commonly attributed to Rafael Cardinal Merry del Val (1865-1930), Cardinal Secretary of State of the Holy See under Pope Pius X. Father Charles Belmonte, S.Th.D., a priest of the Opus Dei Prelature who, inspired by the Cardinal, included it in collection, the "Handbook of Prayers" in 1986.

I love Litany prayers and our parish have prayed, sung or chanted the Litany of the Saints during Easter Vigil and the two new litanies, Litany of the Word, and Litany of Peace.

The Litany of Humility may inspire a profound change in a person's life, path, faith and mindset. Try to pray slowly and meditate on the meaning, focusing on how the words relate to your life.

Lord Jesus. Meek and humble of heart, Hear me. From the desire of being esteemed, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**.

From the desire of being loved, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*. From the desire of being extolled, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**.

From the desire of being honored, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the desire of being praised, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the desire of being preferred to others, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**.

From the desire of being consulted, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**. From the desire of being approved, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the fear of being humiliated, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the fear of being despised, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**. From the fear of suffering rebukes, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the fear of being calumniated, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the fear of being forgotten, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**.

From the fear of being ridiculed, *Deliver me*, *Jesus*.

From the fear of being wronged, Deliver me, Jesus. From the fear of being suspected, **Deliver me**, **Jesus**.

That others may be loved more than I,

Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it. That others may be esteemed more than I,

Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.

That, in the opinion of the world, others may increase and I may decrease, Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.


Women's Guild Christmas Luncheon Now Taking Reservations

CMA 2025-2026 begins on June 1, 2025, and ends on May 31, 2026. If you are planning to make a gift from your IRA in calendar year 2025, we recommend that you begin the process in November to assure that the check is received by December 31, 2025.

All monies raised in the CMA are only used for the programs, services, and ministries for which they are designated. No gifts to the CMA are used to satisfy settlement costs associated with abuse.


