



Feast of Christ, the King of the Universe

As the month of November winds down, so too is the Church's liturgical calendar. This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. Today, Jesus continues and reaffirms his message that he is to be found among the poor and suffering—and he continues to suffer in them. Jesus tells

us we should show our love for those in need. This love isn't just expressed in words, but also in concrete actions. On this Feast of Christ the King, we are invited to pledge our loyalty to Jesus, the image of our all-compassionate God. He is our king, whose symbol of kingship is the Cross. Soon we will begin a new liturgical year with the blessed season of Advent. During these final days of the Church year, the readings often challenge us to reflect about the last things; that is, the winding down of life itself and our need to be prepared to stand before Jesus one day and give an account of our lives.

In the course of this week we will also celebrate Thanksgiving.



Thanksgiving is a time for family to gather and share moments of grace and catch up with each other. Thanksgiving is a time to think about one another. Thanksgiving is a time to seize the moment and tell a family member or relative how much they mean to us. If you love someone, tell them. Do not be afraid to express yourself and embrace a family member. Reach out and tell

them how much they mean to you, because when you decide that the time is right, it might be too late. Seize the day, the time, and the moment. Celebrate thanksgiving! Praise God.

Change to Our Giving Trees

After many years of service our Angels have been retired from our Advent Giving Trees.

The trees will now be known as the Jesse Giving Trees. A Jesse Tree is Jesus' Family Tree and starts with the creation of earth up to and including the birth of Jesus. Each symbol has a scripture passage listed to reflect on during Advent, which is a wonderful way to prepare for Christmas.

We will use colored tags with the name of the Organization and the desired gift, whether the gift needs to be wrapped or unwrapped, along with the date that the gift needs to be returned. These tags will have pictures of ornaments on them with various symbols that are found on the Jesse Tree.

There will be flyers of all the readings and the symbols that accompany each reading available in the Narthex on the counters at both the east and the west ends. Please feel free to take one home with you for daily reflection during Advent. Also available will be larger copies of the ornaments that children can take home to color and cut out to make a Jesse Tree of your own.

This letter, edited on our behalf by Bishop Matano, asks the Governor to consider the consequences to this Bill if signed. We hope that as many faithful citizens of NYS as possible can join in. All the other (arch)dioceses in the State of New York will be making a similar letter available to their faithful. In providing the letter, you must personally sign the letter and mail it with your own return address on the envelope. You will find copies of this letter in the Narthex. It is our ongoing hope and prayer to put an end to this proposed legislation.






