


Welcome!

If you are new in the parish, we invite you to become a member of our faith community where we come together to worship the Lord and celebrate the Eucharist. We want to get to know you and recognize there are some challenges in doing so during Covid-19, however, if you can introduce yourself after Mass, we will be grateful. Please know that your prayers, your presence, and support of our beloved St. John's Church are appreciated. Please call or e-mail the Parish Office for registration assistance. You will find contact information on the front cover of the bulletin.

Today we begin a new church calendar year. Advent is most often described as a season of waiting. We, of the developed world find waiting to be time consuming and we get jumpy and fidgety if we have nothing to do but to wait. To some, today's celebration of the First Sunday of Advent is a reminder that there is less than a month before the arrival of Christmas. To others, it means the rush is on to put twinkling lights around the house, to buy what is needed for the Christmas

pastry cooking and to shop for presents and gift cards. While we wait, our fears rise to the surface. Maybe that is why we try to keep busy, so those fears can stay down below the surface, and we can go about our daily lives oblivious.

Today's three scripture readings encourage us to be spiritually uplifted. During the First reading from the book of Jeremiah, God was now promising that a righteous branch would spring up from the descendants of King David. God was instilling HOPE in his people to restore unity. A divided nation needs strong, committed and just leadership for stability and harmony. This Advent begins with this brief pointed message from the prophet Jeremiah. He doesn't need a lot of words to get his message across; he offers the hope that God will provide the urgently-needed leadership. He does not say when this will happen. The promise is given



and the people are invited to put their trust in God's fidelity to them.

Today's Gospel can seem to be very sobering. Jesus doesn't mince his words—there is going to be a reckoning, a judgement—and we do not know when. But we know it is coming, and therefore we need to be vigilant, prayerful and ready. This is not a pious platitude, but a tenet of faith we profess in the creed.

But there are also two other themes in this Gospel passage that we need in

order to have the full picture. First as Cristians, we are encouraged to stand tall in the knowledge that our redeemer is at hand, and to hold fast to the hope that our faith gives us even in times of trial and tribulation. Second, that as Christians we are called to be realistic, to face up to the fact that our world is broken and in need of healing, and yet we are never hopeless. Indeed the Christian view is to see imperfection not as lost cause, but as an opportunity for healing and redemption. All is never lost until that moment of final judgement.

Advent is pregnant with a promise of new beginnings. We have an opportunity to grow, or develop from scratch, a spirituality of waiting—a time of hope—as we pray constantly for ourselves, our world, and our church in the ancient prayer of Advent— "Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus come and Revive us O Lord."

 - # of Donors to date 184 | \$57,712 committed to date
 - % of Goal 72.14% | Donors short by 5 from last year
 - The Diocese is at 56.47%, so we are ahead of the average | We had a monster jump in the amount of dollars committed and the percentage of Goal.
- Special Touch Bakery Pie Sales: As of last count we sold 101 pies. Delivery date is Monday, November 17. Pickup in the Parish Center.
- Certificate of Appreciation: A Certificate of Appreciation
 has been prepared for Anne Marie Nicchitta who has
 retired from the Altar Linens Ministry after 25+ years of
 dedicated and faithful service. This was presented at
 November 9 Mass.
- Coffee Hour is Sunday November 16.
- Community Service at villages at Unity, while Barb and Bob Gotham were waiting to begin on 11/9, the hallway was lined with Veterans Pictures. Out of 56 people, 22 people raised their hands when asked to raise their hand if they were a Veteran. They joined their voices together to sing the National Anthem at the end of the service. Safety and Security: Nick Sassano

- Can we have a Narcan station? Nick called the overdose prevention and there are some criteria and training that needs to happen to get one. What would be the side effects and liability of the parish in the event we need to administer this?
- Can we have an AED in the Parish Center? We can have one only if there is public access and we have a person that has taken a course (every assembly would need a certified person). So we are not allowed one based on these guidelines. There is a chance that we can have a class a few times a year to learn CPR, Defibrillators and first aid.
- Can we have a red plastic sign identifying the location of the first aid kits? Nick will look at getting these.
- Can we get a wheelchair for church? We do have one on the visiting priest cubicle that is available, Nick will look into signage.
- Can we get someone to patrol the parking lot during the Dady Concert? We do have a volunteer to patrol the parking lot for this event, and there will be surveillance on the monitors inside the church.

Faith Stories: Take a few minutes to wonder at the things that God is doing. The church is temporal and eternal. We are invading cyberspace with Christ, which is an amazing thing. Keep in mind all the eternal things that God is giving us. The Lateran Palace in Rome was given by the Emperor Constantine to the Church. 

Reminder on Qualified Charitable
Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to
St. John's Parish

In December, 2015, the IRA QCD Legislation was signed into law permanently.

Under the legislation, donors aged 70½ or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA's **directly** to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transfers <u>up to</u> \$100,000 directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities (i.e. St John's). This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.
- Since a QCD can potentially reduce a donor's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), please discuss your situation with your Financial Advisor.
- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-fee treatment.
- The gift/check must be dated on or before Dec., 31, 2025 to qualify this year.
- The gift needs to be sent directly to the charitable organization which also has to be the payee for the gift.


