

We Believe that Faith is a Gift

As Catholics, we believe that faith is a gift that we receive at Baptism and it grows within us as we live, learn, worship, and celebrate with our Christian family—*THE CHURCH*. Faith is a powerful gift and Jesus in the Sacred Scriptures speaks about it very often. Faith the size of a mustard seed would be sufficient to uproot a

sycamore tree and cast it into the sea Luke 17:6. Because of her faith, the woman who suffered twelve years of hemorrhages was healed simply by touching the tassel of the cloak Jesus was wearing Matthew 9:22. Sight was restored to some who were blind because of their faith Matthew 9:29, and the faith of the men who lowered their friend through the roof brought healing and forgiveness to their paralyzed companion Mark 2:5.

We cannot take the gift of faith for granted. It was in his own hometown of Nazareth that Jesus was distressed by the lack of faith found in his people Mark 6:6. We may profess our faith each week in



the *CREED* but we must guard against just reciting words. Jesus criticized those who performed acts of prayer, fasting or charity in order to appear holy; our actions should flow from the faith we profess right from the time of our Baptism. When we act out our faith, we grow in faith. This weekend, as your Pastor, I am calling on all to act out in faith as

we pray and reflect on the power and presence of God in our lives.

Jesus continually draws us to himself and has written in our hearts a deep desire for communion with him. Faith is our response to this desire expressed in our religious practices and values we hold in life. It is in our faith relationship with God that *In him we live and move and have our being*Acts 17:28. *Faith is a gift from God—a response from us to God.* I am thankful to God for your

Dear Music Ministry and Parish Family,

I hope we can recognize how gifted we are in so many ways and consider joining our Choir Ministry or any other ministries here at St. John's. Our purpose is to lead the congregation in sung prayer and to encourage active participation during Mass. Many contemporary composers of our time rely on and are inspired by these words of virtue: Love, Courage, Faith, Healing, Hope, Joy, Longing for God, Love of God for Us, Mercy, Truth, Welcome and Wisdom. Hymns are sacred, thematic and scriptural. Our mission is to connect us spiritually and to draw us closer to God through music. Liturgical music helps steer a portion of our church life so that we become authentic worshipers. Serving together can only bring us joy, spiritual growth, and at the same time, gain a new family. Let us be that positive change that will help restore our church.

We invite you to become a new member of our Choir Family: The Youth Choir provides musical leadership during the 10:00 AM Sunday Mass once a month from September to June. This vocal ensemble is open to students age 8 and up. Rehearsals are held before Mass and to prepare monthly, we rehearse after Mass. The Adult Choir provides musical leadership during the 10:00 AM Sunday Mass from September to June. This vocal ensemble generally sings in four parts (soprano, alto, tenor and bass) and is open to adults. This vocal ensemble rehearses before Mass in the Church. Additional rehearsal times will be scheduled in preparation for Christmas and Easter Triduum. If you are interested, please come see me after the 10:00 AM Mass.





Chairperson's Comments:

- **CMA UPDATE:** CMA is right around the corner. Our Goal for this year is set at \$81,000, which is lower than last year. If each household in our parish donates \$250.00, we will make our goal.
- Conflict of interest forms: Bob passed out the conflict-of-interest forms for 2023/2024 term and all of the council members filled them out.
- Bob passed around a card from Kathryn Burke thanking Father Peter and the council for dedicating it and placing a picture of Deacon Bob at the entrance to church. Father Peter presented a certificate of appreciation to Pam Tofany-Kern. Father thanked her for all of her time and talent that she gives to St. John's. Pam was grateful for the recognition and thanked the council and Father. Bob also mentioned that there are 5 months that we do not have a ministry signed up for a coffee hour and we may just have to skip those months unless we get volunteers.

Fr. Peter's Update: Father talked about the CMA and that he sent out 600 letters to our parishioners encouraging them to be generous so that we can once again make our goal this year. Father also said that he plans to have a refresher meeting in church for all of the Eucharist Ministers, he has noticed that some things are not being done correctly and would like to refresh the ministers on the proper distribution of the holy Eucharist. Father talked about the Eucharist Revival and said that we all need to participate. We need to reinvigorate worship in our church and our community. We must become missionaries to invite people back to church. Invite your friends, your neighbors, your children and grandchildren. When you come to church you need to sing! Singing is an important element that is special and beautiful. If a visitor attends a singing church, they will want to return. Father said that a few people attended the RICA informational meeting. A couple of people are considering joining our faith and a couple of our baptized parishioners would like to renew and learn more about their faith.

Arts and Environment: Patty Hoag said she is working on a schedule for the upcoming holidays and will be scheduling a meeting with her committee in October.

Certificates of Appreciation: Sharon Miller said that there are 2 certificates that are ready to be presented on Sunday.

Liturgy Committee: Tod - Respect for life Sunday – October 1 at 11:15 AM at Sacred Heart Cathedral. Tod asked if any of the members could attend, and Rick said that he and Kathy would attend. The Blessing of the Pets will be held on Saturday, October 7 at 10:30 AM. All Saints Day Masses will be at 9:00 AM and 12:05 PM. All Souls Day Mass will be at 8:00 AM. The Annual Memorial Mass for deceased parishioners will be held on Saturday, November 4 at 10:00 AM. The 7-Parish Task Force is asking for volunteers for a subcommittee for vocations. Rick Paoletii agreed to join.

Pastoral Ministry/Homebound Outreach Update: Tod said that it is getting easier to visit the nursing homes.

Knights of Columbus Council 3892: Update: Rick Paoletti - We had our final Chicken BBQ for the summer yesterday and it went very well. The knights will be hosting a Holy Hour in preparation for the 40 Days for Life campaign on Monday, September 18 from 6:30-7:30 PM. The campaign begins on Wednesday, September 27 and runs until Sunday, November 5. Saturday, October 7 is our Annual Columbus Day Dinner, the cost is \$25.00 per person and we will have live entertainment. The proceeds will benefit the Margaret Home, which helps young mothers get on their feet.

Outreach – Social Media/Communications
Committee Update: Gary Kern – Website update:

The company that hosts our website is OSV. They are planning to migrate all of their customers to a new platform. After reviewing the costs and many options, we have decided to redesign and relaunch the St. John website on a new platform no longer using OSV. The net savings is approximately \$1700.00 the first year and \$900.00 annually. Gary is asking for help to participate in the review of our existing content and provide updates and is also looking for help with providing maintenance and support for the new site. Training will be provided.

Paul Parkman – Talked about the 7-parish committee which is preparing our churches for the future. Everything we do here at our parish is important and does not go unnoticed. He then gave us numbers on the attendance at all 7 parishes for their weekend Masses and the total was 3,366.


