This story was sent to me by my priest friend, Fr Charles Akoto, pastor of St Catherine of Genoa Parish in Brooklyn, NY.

The last wishes of Alexander the Great...

"On his deathbed, Alexander summoned his army generals and told them his three ultimate wishes:

- 1. The best doctors should carry his coffin...
- 2. The wealth he has accumulated (money, gold, precious stones) should be scattered along the procession to the cemetery...
- 3. His hands should be let loose so they hang outside the coffin for all to see!

One of his generals who was surprised by these unusual requests asked Alexander to explain. Here is what Alexander the Great said:

I want the best doctors to carry my coffin to demonstrate that in the face of death, even the best doctors in the world have no power to heal.

I want the road to be covered with my treasure so that everybody sees that material wealth acquired on earth, will stay on earth.

I want my hands to swing in the wind so that people understand that we come into this world empty-handed and we leave this world emptyhanded after the most precious treasure of all is exhausted, and that is TIME."

We do not take to our grave any material wealth. TIME is our most precious treasure because it is LIMITED. We can produce more wealth but we

communities, our own parishes,

cannot produce TIME. When we give someone our time, we actually give a portion of our life that we can never take back. Our time is our life! The best present that we can give to our family of faith and ourselves is our TIME with GOD. When do we find peace, connection, serenity, and love by our God?

We are part of the Church but also we are part of a society and world that is filled with constant changes and surprises. We bring this reality wherever we go. We don't leave this cultural

reality of change at the church door. Yet despite all of this, we find ourselves searching for stability in our church, but even that reality has changed and continues to change. We are

often experiencing the challenge of this constantly shifting reality, but it is also an opportunity to remember what truly anchors us. As Catholics we have faced changes in our parishes along with our pastoral staff. I invite us to reflect on these questions below in the next few weeks.

- 1. What are some threads—personal beliefs and convictions—that I hold onto in life and helps anchor me amidst shifting sands of change?
- 2. What helps me hold onto them?
- 3. What makes it difficult to hold on? And why?
- 4. What inner resources serve to sustain me?

Let us spend time focusing on what makes us members of St John's Church.

Raising Awareness (before we vote) on the Important Topic of Proposal 1

The following is an excerpt from Bishop Matano's article that appears in the October, 2024, edition of the Catholic Courier.

Prop 1: Intruding Upon the Rights of Parents

"While we always desire to be loyal and good citizens, there are times when our democratic form of government allows us to oppose what we know to be contrary to our Catholic faith and the good of humanity; we are called to mirror the faith of the saints who remained firm in their commitment to Christ.

At this moment in our state's history, we are now confronted with the proposed "Equal Rights Amendment (ERA)" set to appear on the ballot for a popular vote on Nov. 5, 2024, as Proposal 1. This amendment poses a very serious threat to living out our Catholic faith and values, as well as threatening the rights of all citizens."

REFLECTING ON OUR YOUTH AND OUR FUTURE

One common concern that emerges in whatever parish we find ourselves is the future of our church, especially our young people. In the past, forty plus young

people (and their chaperones) have attended the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC). This was a chance for our youth to see a larger dimension of what it means to belong to the Catholic Church. Those who have participated in this dynamic gathering came back with a greater sense of the church and more enthusiasm for their faith. They learned new life skills that will not only help them now but in the future. For many it was a life-changing experience. It is a reminder that our young people are not only the future of the church, but they are the church right now. Each year we acknowledge young people for their example of faith & service as they receive "The Hands of Christ Recognition." The Diocesan Office of Evangelization & Catechesis coordinates, (along with our very dedicated & generous youth minister, the National Catholic Youth Conference, Diocesan youth gatherings, and the Hands of Christ Recognition, along with programs to enrich the lives of our "young church" and many other wonderful undertakings for our young people. We are hoping to return to bring youth to NCYC on pilgrimage in 2025.

College is an important time in a young person's development. It is a time where they make a choice on what career they will pursue. It is also a time for being away from home and making important decisions on their own. One of these decisions is about how they are going to practice (or not) their faith. a Catholic Newman Community is so important to our Catholic young adults on our area campuses. Newman Community is a presence of the church at a pivotal time in a young person's faith development. It is a safe place where Catholic youth can gather with other young Catholics to explore issues of their faith with campus ministers and other committed Catholic faculty. Often the Newman Community will sponsor a "service project." It takes place on the students' spring break. It may involve going to another part of our country or to another country to serve the poor in some capacity. There often is a profound effect this experience of service can have on a college student. The Catholic Ministries Appeal supports campus ministry programs for our young adults at college. The Catholic Ministries Appeal also supports Diocesan programs mentioned above. Your generous support of the CMA will enable us as the church, the people of God, to continue to Extend Christ's Mission, being a strong presence to our youth and young adults at this very critical time in their young lives.

For those who have already made their pledge/donation, we are very grateful and we encourage everyone to do so very soon. We strive to attain our parish goal by the end of December, 2024, although sooner is even better!

As of Tuesday, October 15, 2024, thanks to our 92 early donors, who have pledged \$ 22,225, we have now reached 28.49 of our \$78,000 parish goal.
