First Reading Is 5:1-7

Let me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside; he spaded it, cleared it of stones, and planted the choicest vines; within it he built a watchtower, and hewed out a wine press. Then he looked for the crop of grapes, but what it yielded was wild grapes.

Now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard: What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done? Why, when I looked for the crop of grapes, did it bring forth wild grapes? Now, I will let you know what I mean to do with my vineyard: take away its hedge, give it to grazing, break through its wall, let it be trampled! Yes, I will make it a ruin: it shall not be pruned or hoed, but overgrown with thorns and briers; I will command the clouds not to send rain upon it. The vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, and the people of Judah are his cherished plant; he looked for judgment, but see, bloodshed! for justice, but hark, the outcry!

Gospel Ps 80:9, 12-16, 19-20

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?"

Pastoral Planning: Task Force Update

The Charlotte/Greece/Hilton
Pastoral Planning Task Force met
again on August 29. The bulk of the
meeting was devoted to preparing

for the priesthood of the future when pastoral leaders will likely be responsible for an increased number of parish communities. We want to consider ways to keep the mission of our parishes at the center while trying to relieve our Pastors/Pastoral Administrators of some responsibilities. To help lay members of the Task Force have a better sense of what leaders actually do, each pastoral leader was asked to share some of his actions on a typical weekday. Task force members learned some of the ways that a bridge has been built between Holy Cross and Our Mother of Sorrows. Finally, Karen Rinefierd, who facilitates the work of the Task Force, shared what has been learned from leaders, staff, and parishioners across the diocese about healthy practices in clustering parishes. In October the Task Force will continue its work to draft possible parish groupings to present to parishioners for input as preparation for the time when the Bishop is not able to fill an opening for a Pastor/Pastoral Administrator.
