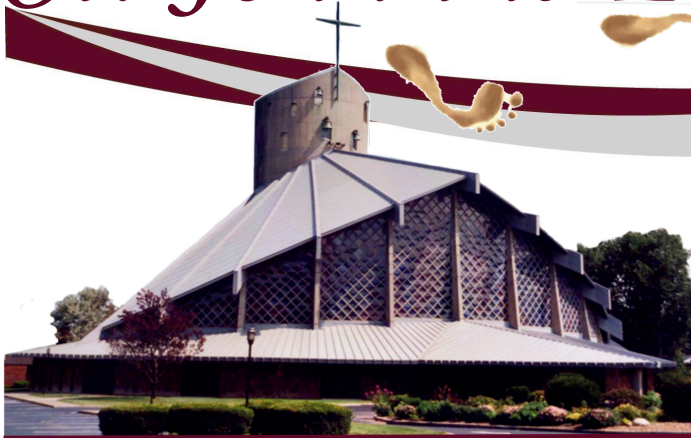

## We Believe that Faith is a Gift

As Catholics, we believe that faith is a gift that we receive at Baptism and it grows within us as we live, learn, and celebrate with our Christian family—THE CHURCH. Faith is a powerful gift and Jesus in the Sacred Scriptures speaks about it very often. Faith the size of a mustard seed would be sufficient to uproot a sycamore tree and cast it into the sea Luke 17:6. Because of her faith, the woman who suffered twelve years of hemorrhages was healed simply by touching the tassel of the cloak Jesus was wearing Matthew 9:22. Sight was restored to some who were blind because of their faith Matthew 9:29, and the faith of the men who lowered their friend through the roof brought healing and forgiveness to their paralyzed companion Mark 2:5.

We cannot take the gift of faith for granted. It was in his own hometown of Nazareth that Jesus was distressed by the lack of faith found in his people Mark 6:6. We may profess our faith each week in



the CREED but we must guard against just reciting words. Jesus criticized those who performed acts of prayer, fasting or charity in order to appear holy; our actions should flow from the faith we profess right from the time of our Baptism. When we act out our faith, we grow in faith. This weekend, as your Pastor, I am calling on all to act out in faith as we pray and reflect on the power and presence of God in our lives.

Jesus continually draws us to himself and has written in our hearts a deep desire for communion with him. Faith is our response to this desire expressed in our religious practices and values we hold in life. It is in our faith relationship with God that in Him we live and move and have our being Acts 17:28. Faith is a gift from God—a response from us to God. I am thankful to God for your faith and generosity to our beloved St John's.

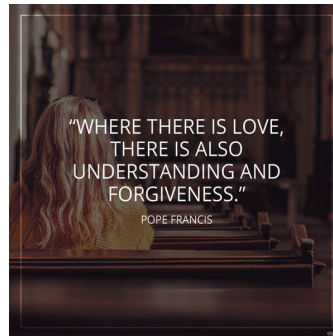
### Help Spread the Good News! - Volunteer Opportunity

### Everyday Stewardship

Life was not always easy with my father when I was growing up. Let's just say he made many decisions along the way that led to fear, anger, and sadness for my family and me. Unfortunately, I was the only one in the family that would years later truly forgive him for his actions. My mother and sister held onto the resentment and anger they felt all their lives. For my father and me, reconciliation led



to several years of a deepening relationship before his passing in 2011. Forgiveness is not easy and I do not consider myself better or stronger because I was able to forgive and my family members could not. However, I can say that the blessings I received due to

forgiveness and a renewed relationship with my father were far better than the animosity experienced by others. I also learned that forgiveness benefited me far more than my father.

As good stewards of time, we must realize that each passing day will never come again. What we do with that time is completely up to us. We can be wise and use it to build bridges, heal wounds, and cultivate love where there is hate. We can also choose to waste time in fear, resentment, and anger. I thank God often for the gift of my dad. However, I thank God more for the gift of time spent with him and the ability to see him not with my human eyes, but with the eyes of Jesus.

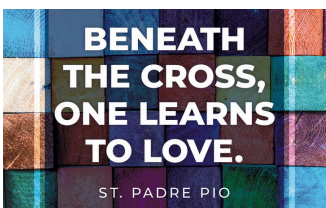


### The Victory of the Cross

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross recalls the discovery of The True Cross by St. Helena and its later restoration to Jerusalem. Once a sign of suffering, the Cross became the symbol of Christ's victory. This feast invites us to embrace our daily crosses with faith and hope in redemption. **Please join us for 8:15 morning Mass for this Feast on Monday, September 14, 2026. Our relic of the Holy Cross will be available for veneration following Mass.**

Some practical suggestions:

- **Make the Sign of the Cross Daily:** This simple prayer, so often rushed or overlooked, is a powerful reminder of our salvation. Begin your day with a slow, reverent Sign of the Cross at home or before leaving for work.
- **Carry Your Daily Crosses with Patience:** Whether it's dealing with stress at work, caring for family, or facing illness, unite these struggles with Christ's sacrifice. Offer them intentionally as prayers for loved ones or for those in need.
- **Keep a Cross Visible at Home:** Just as the basilicas and churches exalted the Cross, place a crucifix in a prominent place in your home. Let it serve as a daily reminder for your family to pray, to forgive quickly, and to live with gratitude for Christ's sacrifice.



*O glorious Cross of our Savior, we adore You as the sign of victory and love. Through the intercession of the Holy Cross, may we carry our daily burdens with faith and patience. St. Helena and all who revered the True Cross, pray for us, that we may live in the hope of Christ's resurrection and share His love with others. Amen.*



### Our Lady of Sorrows

In our Catholic tradition, the month of September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows focusing on the profound suffering of the Blessed Virgin Mary, particularly during the Passion and Death of her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. This devotion, rooted in Scripture and tradition, highlights the Virgin Mary's role as a co-sufferer with Christ, often depicted with seven swords piercing her heart, symbolizing her seven sorrows. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is celebrated on September 15, following the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14, emphasizing the connection between Christ's suffering and that of His Mother. These are the key events in the Virgin Mary's life that are meditated upon in this devotion, as supported by Scripture and Catholic tradition:

1. The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:34-35): Simeon foretells that a sword will pierce Mary's soul due to Jesus being a sign of contradiction.
2. The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15): Mary and Joseph flee to protect Jesus from Herod's threat, enduring fear and exile.
3. The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41-51): Mary experiences anguish when Jesus is missing for three days.
4. Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary (Luke 23:27, John 19:25 context): Mary encounters her Son carrying the cross.
5. The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus (John 19:25-27): Mary stands at the foot of the cross, witnessing her Son's suffering and death.
6. The Descent from the Cross (John 19:38): Mary receives Jesus' body, holding him in her arms (often depicted as the Pietà).
7. The Burial of Jesus (John 19:39-42): Mary accompanies her Son's body to the tomb, facing the finality of his death.

(Sacramental Coordinator and Youth Ministry Leader at St. Leo the Great)



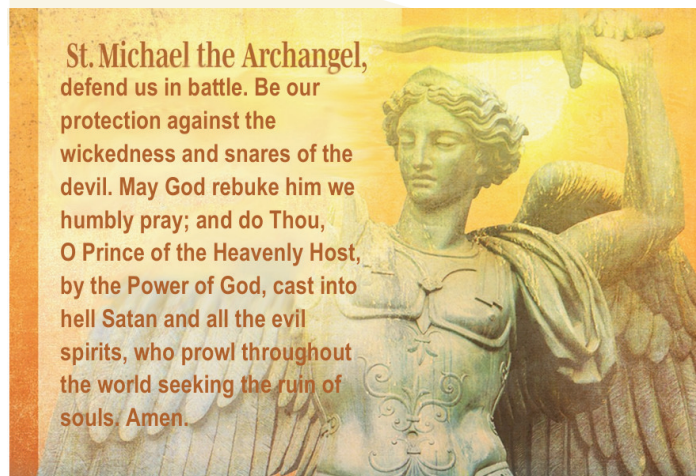
